THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade hereby give notice that the *Moniteur* of the 19th instant contains a French Imperial Decree extending to goods subject to duties of 10 francs per 100 kilogrammes and upwards, the privilege of paying duty on their *net* weight only, which privilege has hitherto been confined to goods subject to duties of 40 francs per 100 kilogrammes and upwards.
