NOTICE OF INTENDED DISTRIBUTION OF CANTON PRIZE MONEY.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset-House, February 7, 1861.

NOTICE is hereby given, to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, that the distribution of the sum of £80,543 15s., awarded by the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury on the 24th November, 1860, being the value of prize captured between the 28th and 30th December, 1857, which has been allotted to the officers and men who were engaged in the operations at Canton within that period, *excluding the Marines serving with the Army, who will share in the amount awarded for the Army*, will commence on Monday, the 18th February, 1861, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset-House."

Agents and other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share of any captor, serving in the under-mentioned ships, are requested to present the same at this office.

Any Officer, Seaman, Marine, or other person, who may desire to receive his share from the Collector of Customs or of Inland Revenue within the United Kingdom, is required to intimate the same by letter to be addressed "On Prize Business, to

the Secretary of the Admiralty, London,"—in which letter his own place of residence is to be precisely stated, as well as the place of the nearest Collector of Customs, or of Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of prize money.

PARLIAMENTARY GRANT.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset-House, February 7, 1861.

WITH reference to the advertisement which appeared in the London Gazette of the 11th December, 1860, giving notice to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, of the distribution of the sum of 33,000*l.*, voted by Parliament for the Naval Forces employed on the China station, to the eastward of Singapore, between the 1st October, 1856, and the 26th June, 1858, for not less than three months within that period, upon the principle of granting to each person so employed one month's additional pay of thirty days, *but excluding those Marines brigaded with the Army, and consequently receiving field allowances*; Notice is hereby given, that the Commander, officers and crew of Her Majesty's ship Winchester are to share in the above grant, as also the crew of Her Majesty's ship Bittern, who were borne on the books of Her Majesty's ship Winchester for a passage to England.
