IT is hereby notified, that the Right Honourable Lord John Russell, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from his Excellency the Marquis d'Azeglio, the Sardinian Minister in London, an official communication, dated the 7th March instant, stating that the Sardinian Admiral Persano had, on and from the 5th of March instant, established the Blockade of the Citadel of Messina and of the neighbouring Forts, with a number of ships of war sufficient to render this blockade effective.

The Sardinian Minister further states that he is officially informed by the Sardinian Government, that the commercial port of the city of Messina is not comprised in this blockade, and that such port consequently remains free from blockade and open to trade.
