NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 15). MEDITERRANEAN—WEST COAST OF MOREA.

*Fixed Red Light at Katakolo.*

THE Minister of Marine in Greece has given notice, that on and after the 6th day of February, 1861, a light would be exhibited from the extremity of the jetty in course of construction at the Port of Katakolo, situated in the bay of that name, on the east side of Cape Katakolo, on the west coast of the Morea.

The light is a *fixed red* light placed at an elevation of 33 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from the deck of a ship at a distance of 4 miles.

The lighthouse is of skeleton wood work at the end of the jetty, and at 240 yards from the shore. Its approximate position is given in lat. 37° 41' 30" N., long. 21° 24' 9" E., or by the Admiralty charts, in 37° 39' 10" N., long. 21° 20' 50" East of Greenwich.
