

on board her cargo without ascending the river beyond the said port, shall receive the benefit of a reduction from the dues mentioned in the foregoing table, in consideration of a certain portion of those dues being levied, to cover the expenses of works in the river above the port. The tolls thus reduced, shall be levied according to the following table :—
