The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Peter, situate at Belmont, in the parish of Bolton-le-Moors, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Peter, situate at Belmont aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Prince, Bishop of Manchester, testified by his having signed and sealed this representation, we humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those parts of the said parish of Bolton-le-Moors described in the Schedule hereunto annexed, all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto also annexed, should be assigned to the said church, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Belmont.'

"And, with the like consent of the said James Prince, Bishop of Manchester, testified as aforesaid,

we further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect thereof should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"We, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Belmont, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Bolton-le-Moors, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, which is comprised within that portion of the township of Longworth, which is not included within the district chapelry of Walmsley, heretofore severed from the said parish of Bolton-le-Moors; and also all that part of the same parish which is comprised within that portion of the township of Sharples, which is not included within the district chapelry of Walmsley aforesaid, or within the new parish of Astley Bridge (also heretofore severed from the said parish of Bolton-le-Moors); and also all that part of the same parish which is comprised within that portion of the township of Little Bolton, which is called or known as Horrock's Moor, and is situate to the north-west and west of the Little Bolton branch of the Bolton and Nightingale Trust Road."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Peter, situate at Belmont, in the parish of Bolton-le-Moors, in the county of Lancaster, to be called "The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Belmont," be accordingly made, and that the recommendations of the said Commissioners with reference to the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials in the said church, and with reference to the fees to be paid in respect of those offices, be carried into effect agreeably to the provisions
