EARL RUSSELL, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a Dispatch from Mr. McCoskry, the Acting British Consul at Lagos, dated August 7, inclosing a Treaty concluded by him and Commander Bedingfeld, R.N., commanding Her Majesty's sloop Prometheus, with Docemo, King of Lagos, for the cession of the Isle and Port of Lagos to Her Majesty. The Treaty is as follows:—

TREATY between Norman B. Bedingfeld, Commander, Her Majesty's sloop Prometheus, and Senior Officer of the Bights Division, and William McCoskry, Esquire, Her Britannic Majesty's Acting Consul, on the part of Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain, and Docemo, King of Lagos, on the part of himself and Chiefs.

ARTICLE I.

IN order that the Queen of England may be the better enabled to assist, defend, and protect the inhabitants of Lagos, and to put an end to the Slave Trade in this and the neighbouring countries, and to prevent the destructive wars so frequently undertaken by Dahomey and others for the capture of Slaves, I Docemo do, with the consent and advice of my Council, give, transfer, and by these presents grant and confirm, unto the Queen of Great Britain, Her Heirs and Successors, for ever, the Port and Island of Lagos, with all the rights, profits, territories, and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging, and as well the profits and revenue, as the direct, full, and absolute dominion and sovereignty of the said Port, Island, and Premises, with all the royalties thereof, freely, fully, entirely, and absolutely. I do also covenant and grant, that the quiet and peaceable possession thereof shall, with all possible speed, be freely and effectually delivered to the Queen of Great Britain, or such person as Her Majesty shall thereunto appoint, for Her use in the performance of this grant; the inhabitants of the said island and territories, as the Queen's subjects, and under Her sovereignty, crown, jurisdiction, and government, being still suffered to live there.

ARTICLE II.

Docemo will be allowed the use of the title of King, in its usual African signification, and will be permitted to decide disputes between natives of Lagos, with their consent, subject to appeal to British laws.

ARTICLE III.

In the transfer of lands the stamp of Docemo affixed to the document will be proof that there are no other native claims upon it; and for this purpose he will be permitted to use it as hitherto.

In consideration of the cession, as before mentioned, of the port and island and territories of Lagos, the representatives of the Queen of Great Britain do promise, subject to the approval of Her Majesty, that Docemo shall receive an annual pension from the Queen of Great Britain equal to the net revenue hitherto annually received by him; such pension to be paid at such periods and in such mode as may hereafter be determined.

Temporary discontinuance of Light on Cape San Antonio.

The Minister of Marine at Madrid has given notice, that on and after the 15th day of September, 1861, the light on Cape San Antonio, on the South Coast of Spain, will be discontinued, in order to transfer the lighting apparatus to the new light-tower. This will be accomplished, and the light will again appear on and after the 30th day of October, 1861.

The light will then be 570 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather at a distance of 25 miles.

The tower is circular, 52 feet high, painted white, with the cupola green. It stands in lat. $38^{\circ} 48' 30''$ N., long. $0^{\circ} 12' 44''$ East of Greenwich.

THE Turkish Government has given notice, that on the 16th day of August, 1861, the following lights were exhibited from lighthouses recently erected in the Archipelago and Dardanelles:—

ARCHIPELAGO.

Revolving Light on Sigrí Island, Mityleni.

A revolving white light, eclipsed every thirty seconds, has been established on Sigrí Island, at the west end of the Island of Mityleni, at a height of 180 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather at a distance of 24 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the first order. The position of the lighthouse is given in lat. $31^{\circ} 13' N.$, long. $25^{\circ} 51' 15''$ East of Greenwich, or about half a mile north, and one mile eastward, of the Admiralty Charts.

Fixed Light on Ponente Point, Tenedos.

Also, a fixed white light has been established on Ponente Point, the low western point of the Island of Tenedos, at a height of 59 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather at a distance of 14 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The lighthouse is in lat. $39^{\circ} 50' N.$, long. $25^{\circ} 58' 45''$ East of Greenwich.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Isle Gadaro.

Also, a fixed and flashing light, a red flash recurring every two minutes, is shown from a lighthouse on Isle Gadaro, one mile eastward of the north-east end of Tenedos. The light is 59 feet above the mean level of the sea, and visible at a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The position of the lighthouse is in lat. $39^{\circ} 50' N.$, long. $26^{\circ} 6' 15''$ East of Greenwich.

DARDANELLES.

Green Lights at Seddul Bahr.

Also, two green lights, placed vertically, are exhibited from the south point of the fortress at Seddul-Bahr, about one mile eastward of Cape Helles, on the coast of Europe. The lights are 52 feet above the mean level of the sea, and visible at a distance of 4 miles.

The position of the lighthouse is $40^{\circ} 2' 18'' N.$, long. $26^{\circ} 12' 5''$ East of Greenwich.

Revolving Light of Khephez, or Barbers Point.

Also, a revolving red light, eclipsed every thirty seconds, is shown from a lighthouse near the battery in ruins, one mile south-west from Khephez or Barbers Point, on the coast of Asia. The light is 59 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen at a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The lighthouse is in lat. $40^{\circ} 5' 21'' N.$, long. $26^{\circ} 22' 15''$ East of Greenwich.

Fixed Red Lights on Cape Peshieri.

Also, two fixed red lights, placed vertically, are exhibited from a lighthouse at Cape Peshieri, N.N.W. of the village of Bourgas, on the coast of Asia, at an elevation of 56 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen at a distance of 4 miles.

The position of the lighthouse is lat. $40^{\circ} 16' 40'' N.$, long. $26^{\circ} 34' 15''$ East of Greenwich.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Cape Khoraz.

A *fixed* and *flashing* white light, a flash recurring every *thirty seconds*, has been established on summit of Cape Khoraz, about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the village of Khoraz, on the coast of Europe. The light is 180 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather at a distance of 22 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The position of the lighthouse is in lat. $40^{\circ} 41' 15''$ N., long. $27^{\circ} 17' 15''$ East of Greenwich.

Fixed Light at Erekli.

Also, a *fixed* white light on the west point of the coast south of the Roadstead of Erekli, on the coast of Europe. The light is 164 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather at a distance of 11 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fifth order.

The position of the lighthouse is in lat. $40^{\circ} 58' 28''$ N., long. $27^{\circ} 58' 15''$ East of Greenwich.

Fixed Light at Kutali.

Also, a *fixed* white light on the rock at the western entrance between Kutali and Rabby (Araplar) islands, at an elevation of 49 feet above the sea, and visible at a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fifth order.

The position of the lighthouse is given in lat. $40^{\circ} 30' 34''$ N., long. $27^{\circ} 28' 5''$ East of Greenwich, or about $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles westward of the Admiralty Charts.

Fixed Red Lights on Palio Point.

Also, two *fixed red* lights, placed vertically, on the western point of Artaki peninsula, at the northern entrance of the channel of Rhoda, at an elevation of 138 feet above the sea, and visible at 5 miles.

The position of the lighthouse is given in lat. $40^{\circ} 29' 28''$ N., long. $27^{\circ} 40' 40''$ East of Greenwich, or about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles westward of the Admiralty Charts.

The Turkish Government has given notice, that on the 16th day of August, 1861, the following

lights were exhibited from lighthouses recently erected in the Bosphorus:—

Fixed Green Lights—Pilon de Sultan-Serail.

Two *fixed green* lights, placed vertically, have been established between the villages of Defterdar and Kourou Tcheshmeh, on the coast of Europe, in front of the Sultan's Palace. The lights are about 60 yards from the quay, at an elevation of 39 feet above the sea, and visible at 4 miles.

Fixed Red Lights on Kandili Point.

Also, two *fixed red* lights, placed vertically, on Kandili point, on the coast of Asia. The lights are exhibited above the first row of houses bordering the quay, at an elevation of 112 feet above the sea, and visible at a distance of 4 miles.

Fixed Green Lights at Roumili Hissar.

Also, two *fixed green* lights, placed vertically, on the point of Roumili Hissar, on the coast of Europe. The lights are exhibited under the wall of the fortress, at a distance of 110 yards from the guard house, at the height of 46 feet above the sea, and visible at a distance of 4 miles.

Fixed Red Lights at Khanlijeh Point.

Fixed Red Lights at Jeron Point.

Also, two *fixed red* lights, placed vertically, are exhibited from Jeron point, the outermost point of the low fort of Kavak, on the coast of Asia, at the height of 46 feet above the sea, and visible at a distance of 4 miles.
