WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, was duly adopted on the 15th day of April, 1861, by the district of Blaydon, in the county of Durham, within the boundaries of such district as settled for the purposes of the aforesaid Act, and notice of such adoption has been duly given, in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as required by such Act. Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do hereby, under the provisions of the said Act, issue the following order, and do determine the questions arising on such appeal as follows :-

1. That the aforesaid appeal against the validity of the vote for the adoption of the Local Govern-

ment Act, 1858, by the aforesaid district of Blaydon, in the county of Durham, be dismissed with costs.

2. That the Local Government Act, 1858, shall, from and after the expiration of one month from the date hereof, have the force of law within the aforesaid district of Blaydon.
