(No. 38.) ENGLAND—EAST COAST.

*Revolving Light near Outer Dowsing Shoal.*

The Corporation of the Trinity House, London, has given Notice, that a light vessel has been placed on the west side of the Outer Dowsing Shoal, off the coast of Lincolnshire in the North Sea.

The light is a quick revolving light showing a red face every twenty seconds. It is elevated 38 feet above the level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 10 miles.

The light vessel lies in 9 fathoms at low water springs, with Spurn high lighthouse bearing N.W. by W.  $33\frac{1}{4}$  miles; Dudgeon light vessel S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., southerly,  $13\frac{1}{4}$  miles; Cromer lighthouse S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 34 miles; north extreme of the shoal N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W.  $5\frac{1}{4}$  miles; and the nearest shoal spot E. by N. one mile. The lat. is  $53^{\circ} 28\frac{1}{2}'$  N., long.  $1^{\circ} 2' 40''$  East of Greenwich.

A can (watch) buoy, marked Outer Dowsing, lies three-quarters of a mile E.S.E. from the light vessel.

(No. 39.)—GULF OF ST. LAWRENCE

*Revolving Light on Cape George.*

The Board of Works at Halifax has given Notice, that on or about the 25th day of October, 1861, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Cape George, near the north-eastern extreme of Nova Scotia, at the entrance of Northumberland Strait, Gulf of St. Lawrence.

The light will be a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every half minute. The elevation of the light is about 400 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 25 miles. The light is only shown during the navigable season.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The tower, which is 39 feet high from base to vane, is square, painted white, surmounted by a lantern, and stands on the north side of the cupe in lat.  $45^{\circ} 52' 50''$  N., long.  $61^{\circ} 55'$  west of Greenwich.

Also, that on the 1st day of October, 1861, the light at Pubnico on the south-west coast of Nova Scotia would be changed from red to white.
