Lostwithiel and Fowey Railway.

(Incorporation of Company for making a Railway from Lostwithiel to Fowey — working and traffic arrangements with Cornwall Railway Company.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session for an Act to incorporate a Company with power to make and maintain the following railway with all proper stations, wharves, approaches, works, and conveniences connected therewith (that is to say),

A railway commencing in the borough of Lostwithiel and parish of Lanlivery, by a junction with the Cornwall Railway, near to the western end of a bridge, carrying that railway over the River Fowey, thence to pass in, through, or into, the several parishes, townships, extra-parochial or other places, following, or some of them; that is to say:—Saint Winnow, Lostwithiel, Lanlivery, Saint Sampsons, otherwise Galant, otherwise Gollant, Saint Veep, and Fowey, and the bed and shore of the Fowey river, estuary, and harbour, and to terminate at or near Caffamill Pill, in the borough and parish of Fowey, all in the county of Cornwall.

And it is proposed by the intended Act to enable the Company to be thereby incorporated, and the Cornwall Railway Company to enter into, and carry into effect, contracts and agreements with respect to the working, maintenance, and use, by the Cornwall Railway Company of the intended railway and works, or any part thereof, and the supply and maintenance of engines, carriages, and rolling stock, and other stock and plant for the same, and with respect to the conduct, regulation, and management of the traffic upon, or over the said intended railway, or any part thereof, and the Cornwall Railway, or any part thereof, and with respect to the use, by the Company to be incorporated by the intended Act, of so much of the Cornwall Railway as is situate between the junction therewith of the said intended railway and the station of the Cornwall Railway Company, at Lostwithiel, and also of the said station, and the works and conveniences connected therewith; and with respect to the fixing, levying, dividing, and apportioning, the tolls and charges arising from such traffic, and the tolls, charges, or other consideration, to be paid for such user or otherwise, and to enable the said Companies respectively to levy tolls on their respective railways, or any of them, or any part thereof respectively, and to exercise all such other powers as may be found mutually desirable in reference to the purposes aforesaid or any of them.
