THE following Addresses and Resolutions of Condolence, on the occasion of the Death of His Royal Highness The Prince Consort, have been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to be laid before the Queen.

Cubitt, Mayor.

An Especial Court of Mayor and Aldermen held in the inner chamber of the Guildhall of the city of London, on Saturday, the 21st day of December, 1861, and in the 25th year of the reign of Victoria, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, &c.

Resolved unanimously,

That the Court of Lord Mayor and Aldermen of the city of London desire to convey to Her Most Gracious Majesty the expression of their constant loyalty and heartfelt sympathy.

The mournful event through which Her Most Gracious Majesty has lost the devoted and loyal support of the Prince Consort, has, at the same time, deprived Her Majesty's subjects of a Prince who has for the last twenty years been foremost in the support of every measure which had for its object the advancement of the interests, the refinement of the taste, or the improvement of the moral and social condition of the people of his adopted country.

That Almighty God may grant to Her Most Gracious Majesty resignation under this heavy affliction, and that Her Majesty may be enabled to derive comfort from the recollection of the virtues of the late Prince, and from the sympathy of her whole people, is the earnest prayer of this Court.
