THE following Addresses of Condolence on the occasion of the death of His Royal Highness the Prince Consort, which have been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, have been laid before the Queen by Sir George Grey, and have been received very graciously by Her Majesty:

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign.

WE, the undersigned, Members of your Majesty's Permanent Civil Service, beg leave to approach your Majesty with the humble tribute of our condolence and heartfelt sympathy in your Majesty's deep affliction.

Seldom has a public loss struck so deeply into the hearts of a people as that which we have now

to deplore.

While your Majesty can perhaps alone appreciate, in its full extent, the loss to the nation of the benefits which it possessed in the admirable example, the wise counsel, the judicious influence, the unostentatious usefulness of the Prince Consort, your subjects feel that your Majesty has also to endure the sudden termination of a course of domestic happiness rarely equalled, never surpassed, and which it was their pride and delight to witness

But it is our comfort to think that, in your time of trial, your Majesty is not left without consolation.

Your Majesty has around you those upon whom the example and influence of their father cannot fail to have been deeply impressed, and who, we would humbly hope, emulating his virtues, will seek to soothe the grief and lighten the cares of their Royal Mother.

We trust, also, that consolation is afforded to your Majesty in the knowledge that, from the highest to the humblest in the land, there is not a family in which the sorrows of your Majesty are not felt and regarded as their own.

It is not for us to enlarge upon that higher source of comfort which alone can supply adequate support and consolation under the heaviest afflictions.

But in tendering to your Majesty the assurances of our devetion and sympathy, we humbly pray that He "who hath borne our griefs and carried our sorrows" may support your Majesty in your grief, may heal your sorrows, and be your

Majesty's strength in the performance of your duties.

OPY of a Letter from Earl Russell to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty:

My Lords, Foreign Office, January 31, 1862.

HER Majesty being fully determined to observe the duties of neutrality during the existing hostilities between the United States and the States calling themselves "the Confederate States of America," and being, moreover, resolved to prevent, as far as possible, the use of Her Majesty's harbours, ports, and coasts, and the waters within Her Majesty's territorial jurisdiction, in aid of the warlike purposes of either belligerent, has commanded me to communicate to your Lordships, for your guidance, the following rules, which are to be treated and enforced as Her Majesty's Orders and Directions.

Her Majesty is pleased further to command that these rules shall be put in force in the United Kingdom and in the Channel Islands on and after Thursday, the 6th day of February next, and in Her Majesty's territories and possessions beyond the seas, six days after the day when the Governor or other chief authority of each of such territories or possessions respectively shall have notified and published the same, stating in such notification that the said rules are to be obeyed by all persons within the same territories and possessions.

I. DURING the continuance of the present hostilities between the Government of the United States of North America, and the States calling themselves "the Confederate States of America, or until Her Majesty shall otherwise order, no ship of war or privateer belonging to either of the belligerents shall be permitted to enter, or remain in the port of Nassau, or in any other port, roadstead, or waters of the Bahama Islands, except by special leave of the Lieutenant-Governor of the Bahama Islands, or in case of stress of weather. If any such vessel should enter any such port, roadstead, or waters, by special leave, or under stress of weather, the authorities of the place shall require her to put to sea as soon as possible, without permitting her to take in any supplies, beyond what may be necessary for her immediate use.

If, at the time when this order is first notified in the Bahama Islands, there shall be any such vessel already within any port, roadstead, or waters of those Islands, the Lieutenant-Governor shall give notice to such vessel to depart, and shall require her to put to sea, within such time as he shall, under the circumstances, consider proper and reasonable. If there shall then be ships of war or privateers belonging to both the said belligerents within the territorial jurisdiction of Her Majesty, in or near the same port, roadstead, or waters, the Lieutenant-Governor shall fix the order of time in which such vessels shall depart. vessel of either belligerent shall be permitted to put to sea until after the expiration of at least twenty-four hours from the time when the last preceding vessel of the other belligerent (whether the same shall be a ship of war, or privateer, or merchant ship) which shall have left the same port, roadstead, or waters, or waters adjacent thereto, shall have passed beyond the territorial jurisdiction of Her Majesty.

II. During the continuance of the present hostilities between the Government of the United States of North America, and the States calling the medium of the United States of North America, and the States calling the confederate States of America, all other port, roadstead, or waters subject to the

ships of war and privateers of either belligerent are prohibited from making use of any port or roadstead in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or in the Channel Islands, or in any of Her Majesty's Colonies or foreign possessions or dependencies, or of any waters subject to the territorial jurisdiction of the British Crown, as a station or place of resort for any warlike purpose. or for the purpose of obtaining any facilities of warlike equipment; and no ship of war or privateer of either belligerent shall hereafter be permitted to sail out of or leave any port, road-stead, or waters, subject to British jurisdiction, from which any vessel of the other belligerent (whether the same shall be a ship of war, a privateer, or a merchant ship), shall have previously departed, until after the expiration of at least twenty-four hours from the departure of such lastmentioned vessel beyond the territorial jurisdiction of Her Majesty.

III. If any ship of war or privateer of either belligerent shall, after the time when this order shall be first notified and put in force in the United Kingdom and in the Channel Islands, and in the several colonies and foreign possessions and dependencies of Her Majesty, respectively, enter any port, roadstead, or waters belonging to Her Majesty, either in the United Kingdom, or in the Channel Islands, or in any of Her Majesty's colonies or foreign possessions or dependencies, such vessel shall be required to depart and to put to sea, within twenty-four hours after her entrance into such port, roadstead, or waters, except in case of stress of weather, or of her requiring provisions or things necessary for the subsistence of her crew, or repairs; in either of which cases, the authorities of the port, or of the nearest port (as the case may be), shall require her to put to sea as soon as possible after the expiration of such period of twenty-four hours, without permitting her to take in supplies, beyond what may be necessary for her immediate use: and no such vessel, which may have been allowed to remain within British waters for the purpose of repair, shall continue in any such port, roadstead, or waters, for a longer period than twenty-four hours after her necessary repairs shall have been completed :- Provided, nevertheless, that in all cases, in which there shall be any vessels (whether ships of war, privateers, or merchant ships), of both the said belligerent parties in the same port, roadstead, or waters within the territorial jurisdiction of Her Majesty, there shall be an interval of not less than twenty-four hours between the departure therefrom of any such vessel (whether a ship of war, a privateer, or a merchant ship), of the one belligerent, and the subsequent departure therefrom of any ship of war or privateer of the other belligerent; and the times, hereby, limited for the departure of such ships of war and privateers respectively, shall always, in case of necessity, be extended, so far as may be requisite for giving effect to this proviso, but not further or other-

IV. No ship of war or privateer of either belligerent shall hereafter be permitted, while in any port, roadstead, or waters subject to the territorial jurisdiction of Her Majesty, to take in any supplies, except provisions and such other things as may be requisite for the subsistence of her crew; and except so much coal only as may be sufficient to carry such vessel to the nearest port of her own country, or to some nearer destination; and no coal shall be again supplied to any such ship of war or privateer, in the same or any other port, roadstead, or waters subject to the

territorial jurisdiction of Her Majesty, without special permission, until after the expiration of three months from the time when such coal may have been last supplied to her within British waters as aforesaid.

# India Office, January 30, 1862.

THE following extracts from General Orders issued by the Government of India, regarding the payment of the Delhi Prize Money, are published for general information:

"His Excellency the Governor-General in Council, is pleased to authorize the immediate issue of a 1st distribution of the Delhi Prize Booty, at the rate of 86 (eighty-six) rupees, each share.

"The General Prize Committee will prepare as soon as practicable, statements showing the names of the European officers and soldiers entitled to share who have left India, and the amount payable to each, for transmission to Her Majesty's Secretary of State for India, in order that the sums due to parties in England, may be passed to them at the earliest possible date.

"Prize money being admissible only in the ranks in which individuals actually served, promotion with back rank gives no claim to share in rank higher than that in which service was performed. Officers and men who died, were killed, or left the army before Delhi, in consequence of sickness or wounds, are entitled to share in the rank they actually held on the date they died or left, and those present at the capture of Delhi or Jhujjur are entitled in the ranks they held on the 20th September and 18th October, 1857."
