

**COURT FOR RELIEF OF INSOLVENT DEBTORS.**

The following PERSONS, who, on their several Petitions filed in the Court, have obtained Interim Orders for protection from process, are required to appear in Court as hereinafter mentioned, at the Court-House, in Portugal-Street, Lincoln's-Inn, as follows, to be examined and dealt with according to the Statute :

Charlotte Blinks, late of No. 9, Barham-street, St. John's, Southwark, Surrey, Widow, carrying on the business of a Lighterman, in copartnership with Joseph Blinks, under the style of "Blinks and Son," and next and now lodging at No. 4, Parker's-terrace, Great George-street, Bermondsey, Surrey, out of business.

Joseph Blinks, late of No. 23, Church-street, Bermondsey, Surrey, carrying on the business of a Lighterman, at No. 9, Barham-street, St. John's, Southwark, Surrey, in copartnership with Charlotte Blinks, under the style of "Blinks and Son," and now of No. 1, Church-row, Horsleydown, Surrey, Journeyman Lighterman, in the service of Mr. Edmunds, of St. Dunstan's-hill, in the city of London, Lighterman.

John Godden, formerly of No. 64, Shepperton Cottages, having a place of business at No. 18, Mintern-street Mews, both in the New North-road, Hoxton, Middlesex, trading in copartnership with Isaac Albert Crofts, under the style of "Crofts and Godden," Hearth Rug Manufacturers, then of No. 1, Somerset-place, Bevis-street, New North-road aforesaid, trading in copartnership as aforesaid, and now of No. 16, Stoke-terrace, Bevis-street aforesaid, in no business.

Edmund Richard May, formerly of the Red Cross, North Cray, Managing a Publican's Business (but having the license in his own name), and also a Carman and Dealer in Coals and Wood, then of the Six Bells, Bexley, Kent, Beer Retailer, Brewer's Drayman, and Coal Dealer, and now of the same place, Brewer's Drayman.

Joseph Frampton Dale, formerly of No. 26, Deverell-street, Dover-road, Importer of Eggs and Butter, and Dealer in Dried Herrings, then of No. 42, Great Bland-street, Dover-road aforesaid, in the same business, and also a Dairyman and Chandler's-shop Keeper, then of No. 3, Victoria-terrace, Portland-place, Clapham-road, then of No. 3, Victoria-terrace, Royal-road, Kennington-park, then of No. 23, York-road, Lambeth, all in Surrey, Dealer in Eggs, Fresh Butter, and Dried Herrings, then of No. 1, Webber-street, Notting-hill, then of No. 3, Prospect-buildings, North-hill, Highgate, both in Middlesex, Cheesemonger's Shopman, and now of No. 4, John-street, Blackfriars-road, Surrey, Servant to a Provision Dealer.

William Henry Lemay, of No. 2, Norman-road, Old Ford, Bow, previously of Regent's-cottage, Old Manor-road, Stepney, all in Middlesex, and formerly of Alma-cottage, Roman-road, Old Ford aforesaid, Clerk.

Elizabeth Tidie, Spinster, carrying on business under the style of Mrs. Elizabeth Jackson, of No. 4, Belsize-terrace, Hampstead, Middlesex, Schoolmistress and Boarding School Proprietor.

Robert Thomas Wallace (sued as Robert Wallace), of No. 183, Albany-road, Old Kent-road, Camberwell, Surrey, Clerk to a Colonial Broker.

N.B.—1. Any creditor may attend and give evidence and produce witnesses. Opposition can only be made by the Creditor in person or by Counsel appearing for him.

2. The petition and schedule, and all books papers, and writings filed, will be produced by the proper officer for inspection and examination until two clear days before the hearing.

3. Creditors' assignee may be chosen according to the Statute.

4. Persons indebted to the said Insolvent Debtors respectively, or having any of their effects, are to pay and deliver the same to the Official Assignee being the Provisional Assignee of the Court, at the said Court, and to no other person.
