To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's faithful subjects of the county of York, in County Meeting assembled, beg to offer to your Majesty our humble and sincere expression of condolence upon the deep affliction with which it has pleased Almighty G-d to visit your Majesty.

It is unnecessary for us to dwell upon the stainless character and domestic virtues of the illustrious Prince whose loss we, in common with the whole nation, so greatly deplore.

Amidst the general and unfeigned grief of the whole community, we remember with pride and gratitude that this county has been twice honored by his presence ; and we trust that the example he has left us of unwearied efforts to promote the essential good and comfort of his fellow creatures will not be without its fruits.

We had hoped that the same genius which first imagined and so successfully carried out the Exhibition of 1851, would have aided the inauguration and development of that of 1862.

It only remains for us, whilst submitting ourselves humbly to the decrees of the Almighty, most dutifully to tender to your Majesty the assurance of our deepest and most heartfelt sympathy in this our common calamity.
