THE following Address of Condolence on the occasion of the death of His Royal Highness the Prince Consort, which has been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been laid before the Queen by Sir George Grey, and has been received very graciously by Her Majesty :

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's Commissioners for the Exhibition of 1851, incorporated by Royal Charter, humbly beg leave to approach your Majesty with the assurance of our devotion to your Throne and Royal Person, and of our deepest sympathy with your Majesty in the most grievous affliction which has, by the will of Providence, recently befallen your Majesty and the whole nation in the death of your Majesty's august Consort, our much-loved and revered President.

The great conception of the International Exhibition of 1851, for the promotion of which we were originally appointed by your Majesty, was due to His Royal Highness. A conception at once so novel and so comprehensive was only gradually understood and appreciated by the country at large ; and there was reason to fear, so great were the difficulties to be overcome and prejudices to be encountered, that the design itself might have resulted in failure, had not the same mind which originally conceived it watched over the whole process of its organization, and guided and directed its gradual development.

As an illustration of the unwearied assiduity with which His Royal Highness applied himself to the realization of this great scheme, we humbly take leave to mention that he never failed to preside over the numerous meetings of the Commission (except on one or two occasions when it met for formal business only) in the two years over which the original labours of the Commission ex-

tended, and in the ten years which have subsequently elapsed. His Royal Highness, with similar regularity, presided over many important Committees of our body, was daily occupied in superintending the various details of our proceedings, and was in constant communication with all classes interested in the undertaking.

The remarkable success which attended the Exhibition of 1851 induced your Majesty graciously to direct the issue to us of a supplementary charter, giving us full power to dispose of the large surplus which that success had left in our hands, in accordance with such scheme as might be devised by us ; and under that Charter we now continue to exist as a permanent Corporation. In our new, as in our original position, the advantages derived from His Royal Highness's enlightened views and deep interest in all matters relating to Science and the Arts were equally felt. On the Kensington Gore Estate, purchased by us, there have already sprung into existence the important Government Department of Science and Art, the gardens of the Royal Horticultural Society, and the buildings of the proposed International Exhibition of 1862 (the natural and necessary complement of the Exhibition of 1851), in respect of each of which the effects of the fostering care of His Royal Highness are plainly discernible to all.

Irreparable as will be to us the loss of His Royal Highness's assistance in the discharge of the important duties graciously intrusted to us by your Majesty, it will be more than ever incumbent on us, animated by his example and reverencing his memory, to continue our exertions to perform those duties to your Majesty's satisfaction ; and it is our earnest prayer that your Majesty—soothed by the remembrance of the good deeds of him of whom your Majesty has been thus prematurely bereft, and of the life devoted by him to assist in promoting the happiness and well-being of your Majesty's subjects—sustained by the love of an united family—and strong in the affections of a prosperous and contented people—may derive that support and consolation from Almighty God which

He in His mercy never withholds from those who trust in Him.

1st. In order that all persons who may have to present claims before the Commissioners, be informed of the time said Commissioners will occupy itself with said claims, public notice shall be given of the place and time, which shall be final, where and when said claims are to be presented.

2nd. That this notice be communicated by the Commissioners to their respective Governments for publication.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade give notice that the Moniteur of the 20th instant contains a French Imperial Decree, admitting free of duty, under certain specified conditions, the following metallic articles intended for re-exportation after being converted, in France, into iron ships and boats, machinery, apparatus or works in metal of any sort, or into articles of a more advanced state of manufacture than the material imported:—

Iron, purified, called *mazée*; broken iron; iron, crude, in lumps; bar and hoop iron, angle, T, , and other iron of irregular shapes; iron in plates; steel in bars, in hoops and brown plates, hot rolled; and copper, rolled, pure or allied with other metals.

The above must be imported, either by land, or if by sea, under the French flag, or under the flag of the country of production.

Exchequer Bills.

The Exchequer Bills, dated in the month of March, 1861 (per Act 23 Vict., cap. 20, anno 1860), with the interest due thereon, will be paid off on the 11th March, 1862, when the interest will cease. Such bills will be received at this office daily, from half-past ten till three o'clock, until the 4th day of March, 1862, inclusive.

Printed forms, containing instructions for the preparation of the lists and the arrangement of the bills, may be obtained on application at this Office.

The holders must write or stamp their names on the face of each Bill, and they must insert their names and addresses, in each list; but where the names of holders are inserted in the body of the bills, the indorsements of such holders must be obtained previously to their lists and bills being left for examination.

New Bills, prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Act 24 Vict., cap. 5, and dated the 11th day of March, 1862, may be obtained in payment of the principal of the whole, or part, of the Exchequer Bills advertized for payment, on the claimants specifying, in their lists, the amount of new bills required by them.

The interest of the said bills will be payable by coupons half-yearly, on the 12th September and 12th March, at the Bank of England. The rate of interest will be advertized from time to time in the "London Gazette." Such rate for the half-year to the 11th day of September, 1862, will be £3 per cent. per annum.

The bills will be current, from year to year, for a period of five years, commencing on the 11th March, 1862, at the option of the holders; and they will be payable for duties, aids, and taxes, at any time during the last six months of every year, viz.: between the 11th September in each year, and the 11th March following.

Notice will be given yearly of the days on which holders of the new Exchequer Bills, who may be desirous of being paid the principal moneys, must send their Bills to the Bank of England for examination and payment.
