THE following Address of Condolence on the occasion of the death of His Royal Highness the Prince Consort, which has been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been laid before the Queen by Sir George Grey, and has been received very graciously by Her Majesty :

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's most loyal subjects, the President, Council, and Fellows of the Royal Society of Literature desire humbly to approach your royal person with the heartfelt expression of our sympathy in your great sorrow, and to testify our sense of the irreparable loss your Majesty and your Royal house have sustained in the death of your illustrious Consort.

Sharing as we do the grief which has thrilled the heart of the nation as one man, we have a special reason, as members of a Literary Society, for lamenting the loss of one who applied the advantages of his high position, together with the powers of his well cultivated mind, to the advancement of useful knowledge among all classes of your Majesty's subjects. His exertions for the encouragement of literature, science, and the arts, will be gratefully remembered by all who cultivate such pursuits, and we believe that they will long feel the fostering influence of his bright example.

We earnestly pray that Almighty God will support your Majesty and your bereaved family in this your deep affliction, and will prolong your reign over a loyal and affectionate people for many years in wealth, peace, and happiness.

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the Inhabitants of the Presidency of Bombay, approach your Majesty with the deepest sympathy and condolence on the occasion of the heavy visitation with which it has pleased an All-wise Providence to afflict your Majesty and the British Empire by the removal from this life of your Majesty's beloved Consort. While we humbly present to your Majesty the expression of our heartfelt sorrow, we venture to offer at the same time the renewed assurance of our profound and respectful loyalty and devotion.

Distinguished by his veneration for the ancient constitution of the realm, by his wide-spread philanthropy, and by the eloquent and never-

ceasing support afforded by His Royal Highness to the advancement of learning and to the tasteful cultivation of the fine arts, and of manufactures throughout all your Majesty's dominions, the late Illustrious Prince Consort adorned his eminent position by the practice of every domestic virtue, and of the most varied accomplishments.

It is the fervent trust of your Majesty's subjects in this Presidency, that, through the Divine mercy, your Majesty will find consolation and support in the gentle influence of His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, and of their Royal Highnesses the other Members of your Family. For this we pray most heartily, as well as for your Majesty's health, long life, and honor.
