THE following Address of Condolence on the occasion of the death of His Royal Highness the Prince Consort, which has been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been laid before the Queen by Sir George Grey, and has been received very graciously by Her Majesty :

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, your Majesty's faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops, and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled, approach your Majesty with the expressions of our dutiful reverence for your Throne, and our loyal affection for your Royal Person.

We beg to be allowed to assure your Majesty that, in the heavy and well nigh overwhelming sorrow with which God in His inscrutable wisdom has recently visited your Majesty, we have most deeply sympathised with your afflicted heart; and as it is our special duty to do, have, without ceasing, offered up for your Majesty, and your bereaved family, our prayers and intercessions.

By none of all your Majesty's loyal subjects could the pure and virtuous life, and the high and noble character of your Royal Consort, be more valued than it has been by the Spirituality of your realm. Year by year we have thanked God that the Royal Family of our beloved Queen shone before the nation with so bright a lustre of family virtue; and that he who stood closest to your Majesty showed so conspicuous an example of subjecting the greatest gifts of intellect and of station to the unvarying law of duty. With the whole of a grateful and loyal people, we mourn for the Nation's loss, and your Majesty's irreparable bereavement.

We pray Him, who only can, to be your support and comforter in these dark hours. We beseech him to cheer your sadness, through the

love of your Royal Family; through the loyal affection of your people; through the remembrance of the past, and the blessed hope of a future reunion, through Christ Jesus our Lord, with those who have gone before; and, above all, we pray Him, by His own presence, to pour into your wounded heart His peace, which passeth all understanding.

NOTICE.—NAVAL MEDALS FOR CHINA.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy. Admiralty, Somerset House, 4th April, 1862.

HER Majesty having been graciously pleased to grant a Medal to the officers, seamen, and marines, engaged in the late wars with China, as well as distinctive Clasps for the various successful operations against the enemy, on the dates hereinafter stated.

Notice is hereby given, that the medals and clasps are now ready for issue in this Department, and for which application may be made, either personally or by letter, producing the requisite certificates in support of the claim both for the medal and the clasps.

The periods of service for which the medal is granted, are as follows:—

For the first period of the China War.

To the Naval and Marine Forces who took part in the operations in China, from 1st October, 1856.

To the date of the signing of the Treaty of Tientsin, on the 26th June, 1858.

For the second period of the China War.

To the Naval and Marine Forces, who took part in the re-commencement of operations against the enemy, from the 1st August, 1860.

To the day on which the Treaty of Peace was signed at Pekin, on the 24th October, 1860.

CLASPS are awarded for the following distinctive services:—

China, 1842.

To those already in possession of a medal for the China Wars of 1841 and 1842, who have also been engaged in the late wars of 1856 and 1860.

Fatshan, 1857.

To those actually present during the successful operations against the Chinese war junks, which commenced in the Escape Creek on the 25th May, and were finally closed at Fatshan on the 1st June, 1857.

Canton, 1857.

To those actually present at Canton on the 28th and 29th December, 1857, when that city was bombarded, and finally captured.

Taku Forts, 1858.

To those actually engaged in the operations which ceased with the first capture of the Taku Forts on the 20th May, 1858, and led to the Treaty of Tientsin.

Taku Forts, 1860.

To those actually present at the capture of the Taku Forts on the 21st August, 1860.

Pekin, 1860.

To those actually present before Pekin, the day the gate of that city was given up to the allied army: viz., 13th October, 1860.
