LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY SANDBACH,
CHESHIRE.

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, was duly adopted, on the 21st day of January, 1862, by the township of Sandbach, in the parish of Sandbach, in the county of Chester; and notice of such adoption has been duly given, in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as required by such Act; and whereas it has now been duly certified to me that a copy of such notice has been advertized for three successive weeks in the Macclesfield Courier and Herald, that being one of the local newspapers published and circulated in the aforesaid township, and that copies of such notice have also been affixed to the principal doors of each church and chapel in such township to which notices are usually affixed; and the period of twenty-one days fixed by the said Act for appeal against the resolution for the adoption of the said Act by such township has now expired, and no such appeal has been made:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby give notice, that the Local Government Act, 1858, has been duly adopted within the said township of Sandbach, in the county of Chester, and that, in accordance with the provisions thereof, the said Act will, at the expiration of two months from the date of the passing of the aforesaid resolution, have the force of law within such township of Sandbach.

PROVISIONAL ORDERS.

Malmesbury Third District Turnpike Road.

WHEREAS the Trustees of the Malmesbury Third District Turnpike Road, acting under the powers of the Local Act of the 11th of George the Fourth, cap. 19, have made application to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, pursuant to the Act of the session holden in the 14th and 15th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, cap. 38, and the Act of the 24th and 25th of Victoria, cap. 46, section 2, for a Provisional Order, to reduce the rate of interest on the mortgage debt charged or secured on the tolls or revenues of the said road.

And whereas the said application is dated the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and is signed by seven of the said trustees, who therein certify that the persons entitled to more than two-thirds of the money charged or secured on the tolls of the said road, and remaining unpaid, have signified their consents in writing under their hands to the said application;

And whereas it appears desirable to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department that the aforesaid application should be granted upon the terms herein set forth;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the power and authority of the said Act of the 14th and 15th of Victoria, cap. 38, given to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and in conformity with the said application, I do by this Provisional Order under my hand declare,—subject to the confirmation hereof by Parliament,—that from the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the rate of interest shall be reduced from four pounds to two pounds per centum per annum upon the bonded or mortgage debt of seven thousand five hundred and sixty pounds, charged or secured upon the tolls or revenues of the said road.
