

CONTRACT FOR CLEANSING AND REPAIRING BED CASES, PILLOW CASES, AND BLANKETS, AND FOR CLEANSING HAMMOCKS, COTS, AND BISCUIT BAGS.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that on Friday, the 9th May next, at half past one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for twelve months certain, and further until the expiration of three months' warning, for

Cleansing and Repairing Bed Cases, Pillow Cases, and Blankets, and for Cleansing Biscuit Bags, Hammocks, and Cots.

The articles to be taken from Her Majesty's Yard at Deptford, and to be returned into Store when cleansed and repaired.

No tender will be received unless made on the printed form provided for the purpose, and which may be obtained on application at the said office.

Particular attention is called to the recent modifications of the conditions of the contract, which may be seen at the said office.

No tender will be received after half-past one o'clock, on the day of treaty; and it will not be required that the party tendering, or an agent on his behalf, should attend at the office on the day of contract, as the result of the offer received from each person will be communicated to him and his proposed sureties in writing.

Every tender must be addressed to the Secretary of the Admiralty, and bear in the left-hand corner the words "Tender for Cleansing Bedding, &c.," and must also be delivered at Somerset House, signed by two responsible persons, engaging to become bound with the person tendering in the sum of £600 for the due performance of the contract.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby give notice, that on Tuesday the 29th instant, at half-past one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford, the undermentioned articles; viz.:

Blue Baize, 4,000 yards; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

White Tape (half inch), 828,000 yards; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

White Dutch Tape, 10,000 pieces; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Blue Striped Cotton Shirting (for Shirts), 332,500 yards; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Buttons (small White Metal, 4-hole, for Shirts), 3,300 gross; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Linen Thread (for Shirts), 1,600 reels, of 300 yards each; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Cotton (Drab Twilled), 4,000 yards; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Blue Worsted Tape, 370,000 yards; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

White Thread, 3,500 lbs.; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Whited Brown Thread, 2,000 lbs.; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Blue Worsted, 11,500 lbs.; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

White Metal Buttons, 18,000 gross; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Horn Buttons (small black), 5,800 gross; half to be delivered in four calendar months, and the remainder in two calendar months afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Their Lordships reserve to themselves the power, when the tenders are opened, of contracting either for the whole, or for such part thereof only as they may deem fit, or for a greater quantity, or of not contracting for any.

Tenders will be admitted for any portion of the above quantities.
