required, and pay the pilotage fees. The pilot who brought the vessel into port being first intitled to her outwards, subject to the approval of the master or owner of the ship or vessel.

21. Each pilot shall be furnished with, and keep in his possession, a printed copy of these bye-laws and regulations, and he shall produce the same to the Master of any vessel or other person employing him, when required to do so, under a penalty, in case of default, of not exceeding £5.
