THE following Address of Condolence on the occasion of the death of His Royal Highness the Prince Consort, which has been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been laid before the Queen by Sir George Grey, and has been received very graciously by Her Majesty:

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, Deemsters, and Keys of the Isle of Man, in Tynwald assembled, with the deepest sentiments of duty and affection towards your Throne and Person, humbly beg leave to express our sincere and heartfelt condolence in the sad and irreparable bereavement with which it has pleased the Almighty Disposer of all human events to visit your Majesty and your Royal Children, by the Death of His Royal Highness the Prince Consort.

We feel assured that in no part of your Majesty's dominions has the loss of that great and good Prince been more deeply lamented than by the small, but ancient and ever-loyal nation which we have now the honour to represent; but, while

we mourn the sad event, it is no small source of consolation to feel that the wise and judicious counsels of so good, noble, and virtuous a Father will, for generations to come, shine forth in the wisdom and illustrious deeds of his Royal Descendants.

We earnestly pray that your Majesty and your Royal Family may continue to be sustained and comforted under this severe bereavement, and that He who in His wisdom has afflicted, may, with Divine strength and support, enable your Majesty long to govern these kingdoms with that justice and mercy with which your reign has ever been distinguished.

WITH reference to the Notification, dated Foreign Office, March 11th last, and published in the Supplement to the London Gazette of March 12th last, on the subject of the Blockade by His Majesty the King of Greece of some of the Coasts of the Gulf of Argolis, it is hereby notified that the Right Honourable the Earl Russell, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from the Greek Chargé d'Affaires at this Court an official communication, dated the 6th May instant, stating that the Insurrection of Nauplia having been completely subdued, the King's Government had raised the Blockade imposed on the $\frac{1}{2}$ of February, 1862, upon a part of the Gulf of Argolis, and that the Greek Department of Marine had published a notification to this effect, dated the $\frac{1}{2}$ of April.

Printed copies of such notification, in the Greek and French languages (of which a Translation is hereto appended), were transmitted by the Greek

Chargé d'Affaires with the above-mentioned communication, accompanied by a request that the notification might be made known to Her Majesty's subjects.

[Translation of the Notification.]

Notification relative to raising the Blockade, placed the $\frac{1}{2}$ February, 1862, on part of the Gulf of Argolis.

It is notified by these Presents, that the blockade placed in virtue of our notification of the $\frac{1}{2}$ February, 1862, on the coasts of the Gulf of Argolis, between the anchoring-ground of Astros, not comprised, and the Bay of Vourlia therein comprised, has been raised from the $\frac{1}{2}$ of this month.

(No. 7.) WEST INDIES—MARTINIQUE.

Fixed Light on Caravelle Peninsula.

THE Authorities at Martinique have given notice, that on and after the 1st day of June, 1862, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse

recently erected on the Caravelle Peninsula, the north-east extremity of Martinique.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, elevated 410 feet above the mean level of the sea, and will be seen in clear weather from a distance of 24 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses of the first order.

The tower is white, and stands on the summit of Caracoli Hill, at a quarter of a mile inland, in lat. 14° 46' 15" N., long. 60° 52' 53" West of Greenwich. The Caravelle Rock bears North, distant 2½ miles.
