Whitehall, July 5, 1862.

THE Queen has been pleased to declare and ordain that His Grand Ducal Highness The Prince Frederic William Louis of Hesse, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, shall henceforth upon all occasions whatsoever, be styled and called "His Royal Highness," before his name, and such titles as now do, or hereafter may, belong to him.

And to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

Westminster, July 7, 1862.

This day the Lords being met a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usber of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to apply the sum of ten millions out of the Consolidated Fund to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two.

An Act to continue the Act of the second and third years of Victoria, chapter seventy-four, for preventing the administering of unlawful oaths in Ireland, as amended by an Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Victoria.

An Act for vesting in Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department the lands of the Royal Military College at Sandhurst, and for completing certain exchanges of lands now or late of the said college.

An Act for the discontinuance of Portsdown Fair, in the county of Southampton.

An Act to amend the Acts for the regulation of public-houses in Scotland.
