ADMIRALTY NOTICE RESPECTING LIGHTS AND SIGNALS TO BE CARRIED BY SEA-GOING VESSELS EMPLOYED IN LAYING TELEGRAPHIC CABLES.

By the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

BY virtue of the power and authority vested in us, we hereby make the following Regulations, and require and direct that they be strictly observed and carried into effect on and after the 1st day of September next. The following Regulations are to be read with and construed as forming part of the Regulations issued by us, and dated 24th February, 1858, viz., the "Admiralty Regulations as to Lights and Fog Signals to be carried by Steam and Sailing Vessels under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854."

Steam Vessels employed in laying down Telegraph Cables.

1. All sea-going steam vessels employed in laying down telegraph cables when under steam shall, between sun-set and sun-rise, exhibit the following lights in addition to the mast-head and coloured side lights required by the Regulations issued by us, and dated 24th February, 1858, viz. :—

Two bright red lights hung vertically below the white light at the fore-mast head, each of the intervals between the lights to be four feet.

The red lights required by this Regulation shall be so constructed as to be visible to the same distance, and in the same direction as the white light.

2. All sea-going steam vessels employed in laying down telegraph cables when under steam shall, between sun-rise and sun-set, carry the following distinctive signals, viz. :—

Two opaque black balls hung vertically from the fore-mast head.

The lower ball shall be four feet from the upper ball.

Each of these balls shall be not less than three feet in diameter.
