NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 30.)—ENGLAND—BRISTOL CHANNEL.

Revolving Red Light near Scarweather Sand.

THE Corporation of the Trinity House, London, has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of October, 1862, a light vessel would be placed near the west end of the Scarweather Sand, in the Bristol Channel.

The light is a *revolving* light, showing a bright red face three times in a minute. It is elevated 38 feet above the level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 10 miles.

The light vessel lies in 14 fathoms low water springs, with Tears point just open of Slades bluff bearing N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N.; Constantinople cottages in line with the entrance of Port Talback N.E. by E. easterly; Mumbles light N. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., distant $7\frac{3}{16}$ miles; West Scarweather buoy N.E. by E., distant $1\frac{1}{16}$ miles; Nash high lighthouse S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., $14\frac{1}{16}$ miles; and Helwicks light vessel N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., $18\frac{1}{16}$ miles.

In order to render the Scarweather light vessel more readily distinguishable in the day time from that of the Helwicks, a half globe will shortly be shown above the usual globe, at the mast head.
