"HER Majesty the Queen left Coburg yesterday at 3 P.M., and arrived at the Lacken Station at 9 A.M. this day."

The Queen has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the metropolitical church of Canterbury to elect an Archbishop of that See, the same being void by the death of Doctor John Bird Sumner, late Archbishop thereof; and Her Majesty has also been pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Most Reverend Father in God Doctor Charles Thomas Longley, now Archbishop of York, to be by them elected Archbishop of the said See of Canterbury.
