THE following Addresses of Congratulation to the Queen, on the attainment of his Majority by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, having been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, for Presentation, have accordingly been presented by him to Her Majesty, who has been pleased to receive the same very graciously :

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the Provost, Magistrates, and Town Councillors of the Royal Burgh of Dundee, humbly venture to address your Majesty, on the occasion of Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, attaining the age of twenty-one years.

We, in co-union with all the other loyal subjects of your Majesty, felt as our own the affliction which so recently fell on your Majesty, by the death of one who had endeared himself to the nation, alike by his public conduct, as by his private virtues. And now, before the period of mourning has passed away, we desire to offer our heartfelt congratulations on the occasion of one who was brought up under the eye of so virtuous, learned, and talented a father, attaining the full age of manhood, and taking his place beside your Throne.

We are aware that in the mind of your Majesty, as in the minds of your loyal subjects, the gladness which so auspicious an event is calculated to excite, must be tinged with the shadow of the great sorrow cast upon it from the recent past. But we may venture to hope that your Majesty's grief will be mitigated, your anxieties lessened, and your labours decreased, by the presence beside you of a dutiful and affectionate son, fitted by his education and qualities to take part in your councils, and in the fulness of time to become the beloved Ruler of a great and powerful State.

We have to express our earnest hope that your Majesty may long be spared to govern the people on whose affections your Throne is placed; and that your Royal son may for many years gather wisdom in your Court, and be confirmed by your example in those habits of domestic virtue which have so greatly contributed to ensure for you the

love of your people; and for which we shall, as in duty bound, ever pray.

NOTICE.

ARTILLERY RANGES ACT, 1862.

WHEREAS, by the above-mentioned Act, after reciting therein to the effect that certain lands in the parishes of Shoebury and Wakering, in the county of Essex (of which the particulars are set forth in the schedule to the Act, and are shewn on the plan thereof deposited with the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty), were vested in, or possessed by, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department,

in trust for Her Majesty. And further, that such lands and premises had been used and appropriated for the practice of artillery, and that it was expedient that the said premises should be kept free from all the anchorage or grounding of vessels, barges, and other craft, it was amongst other things enacted, that so long as the lands and premises mentioned in the schedule to the said Act should remain vested in, or be possessed by, Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the War Department, in trust for Her Majesty, he should from time to time, as occasion might require, cause to be marked out and distinguished by buoys or other sufficient marks to be erected or fixed upon the said lands and premises, such spaces or distances thereon as he might judge necessary to be kept free from all anchorage or grounding of vessels of any kind; and order and direct that the several spaces or distances so marked out and distinguished should be, and remain as, ranges for artillery practice, freed from all rights of anchorage or grounding thereon. And it was further enacted that whenever the said Principal Secretary should have marked out and appropriated any spaces or distances for ranges as aforesaid, all rights (if any) of anchorage and grounding over and upon the same should cease and determine, and a notification thereof should be made to the Lords of the Admiralty, and be published as therein mentioned; and further, that if any vessel, barge, or other craft, unless forced to remain thereon by stress of weather or other unavoidable accident should anchor or ground upon any range marked out in pursuance of the said Act, then the owner or master of such vessel, barge, or other craft as the case might be, should, on conviction thereof before any Justice or Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a sum not less than forty shillings and not exceeding five pounds for every offence.

Now notice is hereby given, that the said Principal Secretary has caused to be marked out and distinguished by buoys, as authorized by the said Act, certain spaces or distances to be kept free from all anchorage or grounding of vessels of any kind, and that he hereby orders and directs that the said several spaces or distances so marked out and distinguished shall be, and remain as, ranges for artillery practice, freed from all rights of anchorage or grounding thereon; and further, that he hereby warns all persons from anchoring or mooring any vessel, barge, or other craft upon the said ranges marked out as aforesaid, under the penalty prescribed by the said Act of Parliament.

Brentford Union.—Parish of Isleworth.

To the Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Isleworth, in the county of Middlesex;

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Isleworth, in the county of Middlesex, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a meeting held at the Vestry Room of the said parish of Isleworth, after public notice in that behalf, on Saturday, the 15th day of November last, it was resolved,—

"That it is desirable that the Act of the 13th and 14th Victoria, cap. 57, or so much thereof as enacts that the Churchwardens and Overseers, with the sanction of the Commissioners for administering the laws for relief of the Poor in England, may by agreement hire a room for the purpose of holding any Vestry and other Meeting for the transaction of any business of or relating to the Parish, and also so much of the said Act as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, be adopted."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution,

Now therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct:

ARTICLE I.—That the whole of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty shall forthwith be applied to and put in force within the said parish of Isleworth.

ARTICLE II.—That the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish shall, unless the Poor Law Board otherwise direct, pay to the officer for the time being appointed to the said office of Vestry Clerk for the said parish, under the authority of the Statutes in that behalf and this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, a salary of fifty pounds per annum, and charge the same to the said parish.

ARTICLE III.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable from the day on which he commences the performance of the duties of such office, and be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Christmas Day, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, and Michaelmas Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators in case he shall die while holding such office.

ARTICLE IV.—That a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.
