THE Remains of Field Marshal His Royal Highness The Prince Consort, Husband of Her Majesty The Queen, and Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, were this day removed from the entrance of the Royal Vault, in Saint George's Chapel, Windsor, in which They had been temporarily placed after the Funeral of his Royal Highness, on Monday, the 23rd of December, 1861, and were deposited in the Mausoleum prepared for Their reception in the Grounds at Frogmore, in the presence of His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., His Royal Highness The Prince Arthur, His Royal Highness The Prince Leopold, and His Royal Highness The Prince Louis of Hesse, K.G.

The Viscount Sydney, Lord Chamberlain of Her Majesty's Household; Lieutenant-General The Honourable Charles Grey, Private Secretary to His Royal Highness The Prince Consort; Colonel The Honourable Sir Charles Phipps, K.C.B., Treasurer to His Royal Highness The Prince Consort; and Colonel Biddulph, Master of the Household, were also present on the occasion.

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Liverpool, approach your Majesty with the expression of our heartfelt congratulations on the attainment of his majority by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.

Fully appreciating the anxiety which your Majesty has ever displayed in promoting the happiness of your Royal Family, we observe with much satisfaction that your Majesty has entered into a treaty

for a Marriage between His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales and Her Royal Highness the Princess Alexandra of Denmark.

We fervently pray that your Majesty may long live to see developed in the character of His Royal Highness the happy results of the care and attention with which he was educated under the direction of your Majesty and your most deeply lamented Consort, and that, when the time shall arrive (which may God long avert) that His Royal Highness is to ascend the Throne of his Ancestors, he may reflect the brilliant example he has received from your Majesty of the well performed duties of a Constitutional Sovereign, and of every excellence in domestic and social life.

At the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Lady the Queen, held at Durham, in and for the said county, on the 13th day of October, in the 26th year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, and in the year of our Lord, 1862, before Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace, of and for the said county, then and there assembled.

HIGHWAY ACT.

*Division of the County into Districts.*  
(Provisional Order.)

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Act passed in the last session of Parliament (25 and 26 Vict., cap. 61), for the better management of Highways in England, notice was given by Henry Fenwick, Edward Johnson, John Fawcett, and William Lloyd Wharton, Esqrs., and Edmund Hector Shipperdson, Clerk, of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for this county, by writing under their hands, requiring the Clerk of the Peace to add to, or send with, the notice required by law to be given of the holding of the then next General or Quarter Sessions, a notice in the form set forth in the said Act, that at this Court, a proposal would be made to the Justices to divide the county into highway districts. And whereas the said Clerk of the Peace added the said notice to that required by law to be given of the holding of these sessions, and posted in a pre-paid letter the notice referred to by the said Act, to all the Churchwardens and Overseers of the said county. And whereas it is not lawful to include in any highway district, any districts constituted under the Public Health Act, 1848, and the Local Government Act, 1858, or either of them, nor any parish or place, the highways of which were, at the time of the passing of the said Act, under the superintendence of a board established in pursuance of section 18 of the Act of 5 and 6 Will. IV, cap. 50. Now at these sessions the Justices aforesaid, having entertained the said proposal, and after due consideration had in the premises, do hereby, by this their Provisional Order, divide the said county of Durham into ten highway districts, for the more convenient management of highways; and order that the said ten districts shall be called the Gateshead and South Shields district, the Durham and Chester-le-Street district, the Castle Eden and Seaham district, the Houghton-le-Spring and Sunderland district, the Lanchester district, the Auckland district, the Weardale district, the Stockton and Hartlepool district, the Darlington district, and the Barnard Castle district; that each of the said districts shall comprise the parishes and places hereinafter mentioned and set forth as belonging to such district, (the word parish meaning every place maintaining its own highways); and that there shall be one Waywarden elected for each such parish and place, such Waywarden to be elected in such parishes or places at the meeting and time and in the manner, and subject to the same qualification and the same power of appointment in the Justices in the event of no election taking place, or, in the event of a vacancy, at, in, and subject to which a person or persons to serve the office of Surveyor, would have been chosen or appointed if such parishes and places had been heretofore under the provisions of the said Act 5 and 6 Will., cap. 50.

And it is ordered, that the said *Gateshead and South Shields District* shall comprise the parishes

or places next hereinafter mentioned, except so much thereof as may have been constituted a district under the Public Health Act, 1848, or the Local Government Act, 1858, or either of them, that is to say:
