PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. *Board of Trade, Whitehall,

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Major Stokes, enclosing the following translation of certain Regulations which have been issued by the European Commission of the Danube, relative to the discharge of ballast in the waters of that river and in the Sulina roads; these Regulations being supplementary to that of the 29th April, 1858.

ART. 1.—Vessels are peremptorily forbidden to discharge their ballast either in the bed of the river or in the Sulina roadstead. They are equally forbidden to discharge ballast in the sea near the roadstead where the depth is less than 10 fathoms. The discharge of ballast on shore above the

port of Sulina, may only take place at such points along the river bank as shall be decided on by the Inspector-General of Navigation,—of which public notice will be given.

Ballast so discharged must be so far removed from the river that the foot of its slope shall be at least 20 feet distant from the natural river bank.

ART. 2.—Every infraction of the provisions of the Regulation of 29th April, 1858, and of those of the preceding Article shall be punished by a fine of from 10 to 50 Dutch ducats. The fine shall be of 100 ducats for a repetition of the offence during the same voyage.

ART. 3.—The Captain of the Port of Sulina will inflict fines incurred for infractions committed in the Port of Sulina, on the roadstead, or in its neighbourhood. Fines incurred for infractions committed in the river between Isaktcha and the Port of Sulina, will be inflicted by the Inspector-General of the Navigation.

The Inspector-General and his superintendents are authorized to demand from the shipmasters the certificates prescribed by Art. 3 of the Regulation of 29th April, 1858.

ART. 4.—The fines shall be paid into the Sulina Navigation Chest, to be applied to the maintenance of the Seamen's Hospital.

In case of an appeal against the infliction of a fine, the amount of the same must be handed over to the Navigation Chest as a deposit.

If the appeal is not lodged within 15 days from the date of its notification to the offender, the amount thereof shall definitively accrue to the Navigation Chest.

ART. 5.—Appeals against the fines inflicted by the Inspector-General of the Navigation and the Captain of the Port of Sulina must be made to the European Commission of the Danube.

ART. 6.—All the provisions of the Regulation of 29th April, 1858, not affected by these present dispositions, shall still remain in force.

The present supplementary provisions shall be enforced on and after the 1st January, 1863.

Leicestershire to Wit.

WHEREAS the Reverend Henry James Hoskins, Clerk, Charles Thomas Freer, Esquire, the Reverend Edward Elmhirst, Clerk, Sir Frederick Thomas Fowke, Baronet, the Reverend Gabriel Edwards Gillett, Clerk, Thomas Calvert Beasley, Esquire, John Martin, Esq., the Honourable Reynolds Moreton, and William Unwin Heygate, Esquire, M.P., being nine of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace acting in and for the county of Leicester, did by a writing under their hands, dated the 27th day of September, 1862, require William Freer, Esquire, the Clerk of the Peace for the said county, to add to or send with the notice required by Law to be given of the holding of the Court of General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county, a notice in the form marked (A) in the Schedule to the Act of the 25th and 26th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 61, intituled "An Act for the better management of the Highways in England," that at the then next ensuing General Quarter Sessions of the Peace a proposal would be made to the Justices then and there assembled, to divide the said county into Highway Districts. And whereas such requisition was duly complied with.

Dorsetshire.—At the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Sovereign Lady the Queen, held at Dorchester, in and for the county of Dorset, on Tuesday, the 6th day of January, in the 26th year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, and in the year of our Lord, 1863, before the Right Honourable Edward Berkeley Lord Portman (Chairman), John Floyer, Esquire (Deputy-Chairman), and others, Justices of our Sovereign Lady the Queen, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lady the Queen, in and for the county aforesaid, and also to hear and determine divers felonies, trespasses, and other misdemeanors, done or perpetrated in the same county, and continued by adjournment to Wednesday, the 28th day of the same month of January, in the year aforesaid, at the Town-hall, in Blandford Forum, in and for the said county, and then and there holden, before the Right Honourable Edward Berkeley Lord Portman (Chairman), John Floyer, Esquire, and others, Justices of our said Lady the Queen, assigned for the purposes aforesaid, and continued by further adjournment to Tuesday, the 17th day of February, in the year aforesaid, at the County-hall, in Dorchester, in and for the said county, and then and there holden, before the Right Honourable Edward Berkeley Lord Portman (Chairman), John Floyer, Esquire, and others, Justices of our said Lady the Queen, assigned for the purposes aforesaid,—it is ordered provisionally as follows:—

Whereas in pursuance of an Act made and passed in the 25th and 26th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, chap. 61, intituled, "An Act for the better management of Highways in England," a requisition thereunder has been duly made by writing, under the hands of more than five Justices of the Peace of this county, to the Clerk of the Peace, bearing date the 26th day of November, 1862, requiring the Clerk of the Peace to add to, or send with the notice required by law, to be given of the holding of the then next, and these present General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace, a proposal would be made to divide the county of Dorset into Highway Districts, and also requiring the Clerk of the Peace to send by post, in prepaid letters, notices in the aforesaid form, to the Churchwardens or Overseers of every parish in the said county, agreeably with the fifth section of the said Act: Now such requisition having been duly complied with by the Clerk of the Peace, and a proposal for such division as aforesaid having been duly made to this Court, in pursuance thereof, the Justices assembled at this present Court of General Quarter Sessions, do accordingly entertain such proposal, and do decide that this county (excluding the parishes of Affpuddle, Moreton, and Tonerspuddle, as being already formed into a district under the Act 5th and 6th William IV., cap. 50, and certain other parishes hereinafter mentioned), shall be divided into Highway Districts, for the more convenient management of its highways, in pursuance and according to the directions of the said Act of Parliament.

And whereas by virtue of the restrictions imposed by the said firstly-recited Act with respect to the formation of Highway Districts thereunder, the following parishes and parts of parishes, situate in this county, are excluded from the districts hereinafter formed (that is to say), the parishes of Melcombe Regis and Weymouth, and parts of the parishes of Radipole and Wyke Regis within the Borough of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis; the parishes of All Saints, St. Peter, and part of the parish of the Holy Trinity, in Dorchester, and part of the parish of Fordington, within the borough of Dorchester; the parish of Bridport and parts of the parishes of Allington, Bothenhampton, Bradpole, Burton, Bradstock, Symondsbury, and Wal-ditch, within the borough of Bridport; the parish of Castleton and part of the parish of Sherborne, by reason of their being respectively situate within districts constituted under the Public Health Act, 1848, and the Local Government Act, 1858, or one of them; and such parts of the parishes of Blandford, Forum, Lyme Regis, and Shaston Holy Trinity, St. Peter and St. James, as are respectively within the limits of the Municipal Boroughs of Blandford Forum, Lyme Regis, and Shaftesbury respectively by reason of such consents not having been given for their inclusion therein as are required by the said firstly-recited Act.

And whereas, there are numerous townships, tythings, hamlets, and places in this county, which separately maintain their own highways, and it is desirable that they should (except such as are hereinafter excepted) be combined, in pursuance of the said firstly-recited Act, with the parishes to which they respectively belong:—The Justices assembled at these present Sessions (being the Court of General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace mentioned in the said requisition) do, accordingly, provisionally order that where a parish, included in any or either of the districts hereinafter formed, separately maintaining its own poor, is divided into townships, tythings, hamlets, or places, each of which separately maintains its own Highways, all such townships, tythings, hamlets, and places (saving those which are mentioned in this parenthesis), each of which being included by name in a Highway District hereinafter formed, is constituted a Parish, as defined by the said firstly-recited Act, and called “a Highway Parish” (that is to say), Outer Lillington (part of the parish of Lillington); Plush (part of the parish of Buckland Newton); Stoborough (part of the parish of the Holy Trinity, Wareham); the out-parishes of Lady St. Mary and St. Martin, Wareham; Benville and Mapper-ton (parts of the parish of Corscombe); Abbot-street, Barnsley, Cowgrove, Petersham, and West Stone (parts of the parish of Wimborne Minster); Milton and Pierson (a tything in the parish of Gillingham); Middlemarsh (part of the parish of Minterne Magna); Newland (part of the parish of Wootton Glanvilles); Waterson and Ilsington (parts of the parish of Puddletown); Childhay, Dibberford, Drimpton, and Littlewinsor (parts of the parish of Broadwinsor); and also saving such out-lying parts of parishes as being tythings or places are hereinafter annexed to a Highway District), shall be, and the same are hereby combined for the purposes of the said firstly-recited Act with such poor law parish; and the said Justices do declare that no separate Waywardens shall be elected for such combined townships, tythings, hamlets, and places; and that each of such combined parishes shall be subject to the same liabilities in respect of all the Highways within it, which have been heretofore maintained by such townships, tythings, hamlets, and places therein separately, as if all their several liabilities had

attached to the whole parish, and that a Waywarden or Waywardens shall be elected for each of such combined parishes as a whole.

And whereas the following parts of the parish of Milton Abbas, in this county, that is to say, Holworth and Liscombe, are not contiguous to the said parish of Milton Abbas; and it being desirable that such outlying parts should be annexed to a Highway District for the purposes of the Highway Acts, the Justices now assembled do accordingly, in pursuance of the said firstly-recited Act, further provisionally order that such several outlying parts of the said parish shall be, and the same are hereby annexed to the districts hereinafter mentioned, in which such several outlying parts are specifically named, so that each of such outlying parts of the said parish shall for all the purposes of the Highway Acts be deemed to be a parish separately maintaining its own Highway. And where in any places named in either of the Highway Districts hereinafter formed, there have heretofore been no Surveyor or Surveyors elected, a Waywarden or Waywardens, as hereinafter mentioned, shall be elected for such places in the same manner, at the same time, and subject to the same power of appointment in the Justices, in the event of no election taking place, as a Surveyor or Surveyors would have been required by Law to be elected or appointed if such places had maintained their own Highways, and heretofore appointed their own Surveyor or Surveyors.
