Westminster, March 5, 1863.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to enable Her Majesty to provide for the establishment of His Royal Highness the

Prince of Wales and Her Royal Highness the Princess Alexandra of Denmark, and to settle certain annuities on Her Royal Highness.

An Act to make provision concerning Bills of Exchange and Promissory Notes payable in the Metropolis on the day appointed for the passage through the Metropolis of Her Royal Highness the Princess Alexandra of Denmark.

Board of Trade, Whitehall, March 6, 1863.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a translation of a Notice issued by the Central Maritime Government of Trieste, declaring that in consequence of the existence of yellow fever in the Canary Islands, all arrivals from thence at Austrian ports, will be subjected to the treatment of fowl Bills of Health established by the Circular of the 17th July, 1859.
