THE following Despatch has been received by Earl Russell from Mr. Christie, Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in Brazil:

Rio de Janeiro,

February 15, 1863.

MY LORD,

I HAVE the honour to enclose a copy of an Address which I received in the beginning of this month from a number of British Merchants and Residents in Rio, who say that they came forward to express their opinion in favour of my recent action in the questions of the "Prince of Wales" and the "Forte," because it has been represented that the English were generally opposed to the late proceedings. All those who have signed the address are persons of known respectability; and forty being, I am informed, the whole number of houses in Rio, eighteen of these are represented among the signatures. I am told that several persons have refused to sign because they did not think it becoming or desirable for them to offer an opinion.

I inclose a copy of my reply to the address.

Many of the English in Rio are Brazilians by birth in the country or by naturalization.

I mentioned in my first report to your Lordship that I had been much pleased with the general attitude and demeanour of the British community. I have good reason to believe that the publication of the correspondence and the conduct of the Brazilian Government, with reference to the arrangement made with me, have greatly strengthened the general feeling of satisfaction among the English with what has happened.

I have no doubt that a few dissentients among the English, and that Brazilian Agents will have done everything in their power to cause it to be represented in England that the English community generally have disapproved of what has happened; and if so, your Lordship may be glad to have the inclosed address, the respectability of all the signers of which will be known to any one who knows Rio.

SIR,

WE, the undersigned, British merchants and residents in this city, having been informed of certain rumours purporting to imply that the British subjects here have almost unanimously disapproved of, and censured the proceedings of your Excellency in, the late diplomatic difficulties with the Brazilian Government, it behoves us to take the liberty of addressing your Excellency, in order to disavow any opinions that may have been expressed to that effect.

Without venturing to emit any opinion upon the merits of the questions discussed between your Excellency and the Brazilian Government, our present object is merely to state, that however lamentable such difficulties must always be, and however detrimental to the interests of those engaged in the commerce of the countries involved, we feel satisfied that, in conducting the late negotiations, your Excellency not only followed the instructions of Her Majesty's Government, but that you did not lose sight of the interests of British subjects in this city.

Having, as residents here, a deep interest in the welfare of this country, and fostering a desire

to maintain friendly relations with its native inhabitants, whose national feelings we cannot wish to see wounded, we venture to express to your Excellency our sincere thanks for the conciliatory spirit with which, for the sake of peace and amity, you agreed to submit to Her Majesty's Government the option of a settlement of the pending questions in a different form from that previously proposed by your Excellency, thus giving an incontestable proof of your prudence and moderation.

In expressing these sentiments, and recognizing the service which, in our humble opinion, your Excellency has rendered to both countries, we consider that we are simply doing justice to Her Majesty's representative.

We would have thought it unnecessary to offer our opinions on this subject, or rather to disclaim any censure of your Excellency's proceedings, but for the circumstances above referred to, which may have given rise to misconceptions on your part, and if so, we think it our duty to endeavour to dispel them.

GENTLEMEN,

I BEG to thank you for your address to me of the 3rd instant, expressing your approval of the

mode in which I lately conducted proceedings necessarily disagreeable to the Brazilian nation, on the refusal of the Brazilian Government to satisfy demands which I had been instructed to make. It is peculiarly gratifying to me to know that so many of my countrymen, interested in peaceful relations with Brazil, think that my conduct was prudent and moderate. I had heard of some, but certainly not of general, disapproval among British subjects. Unanimity can never be expected. Almost all respectable Englishmen, I believe, properly understood the question at issue, and their duty. Many who pass for Englishmen have a divided allegiance, being either by naturalization or birth in this country also Brazilians. It is no imputation against the consciences of such persons that they do not think purely as Englishmen. I took an early occasion to report to Her Majesty's Government that I had been highly pleased by the attitude generally taken by British subjects during the late proceedings.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th of February, 1863, in the words following, viz. :—

"We humbly beg to lay before your Majesty the case of the General Officers of your Majesty's Royal Marine Forces. These officers, owing to the peculiar nature of the Marine Service, are debarred from all further advantages, having no lucrative commands or appointments to look forward to, like their brother officers in the army—and although various measures have been submitted, from time to time, for improving the position of the officers and men of the Corps, by placing them, as nearly as possible, on a footing with the army, nothing has been done for the Generals. Under these circumstances, we propose, with your Majesty's sanction, to appoint a General Officer as Colonel to each of the five divisions, upon the principle adopted in the army in the case of colonelcies of regiments; and to raise the pay of the Officers appointed from £702 12s. 6d. to £900 a-year. This measure will, in our opinion, give general satisfaction, as it will not only afford the means of conferring a reward upon a very meritorious class of old officers; but it will act beneficially upon the whole corps, by giving it the advantage of a few honorary appointments, an advantage not hitherto possessed by that valuable branch of your Majesty's service. We, therefore, trust that your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by your Order in Council, to authorize us to carry our proposal into effect, the Lords of your Majesty's Treasury having signified their concurrence."

Her Majesty having taken the said memorial into consideration was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what

is therein proposed, and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
