To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

WE, your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful subjects, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Oxford, beg leave to approach your Royal person with the expression of our respectful congratulations on the Marriage of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales with the Princess Alexandra of Denmark.

We have participated largely in the universal joy with which this great event has been celebrated by all classes of your Majesty's faithful subjects. But we feel ourselves entitled to a peculiar, and more than common share of the national satisfaction, when we recall to mind the connection which has been permitted to subsist between His Royal Highness and the University. It is our confident hope that the many noble qualities which won for His Royal Highness our warmest admiration and regard will continue to develop themselves more and more to the gratification and comfort of your Majesty; and we recognise some fulfilment of our sanguine expectations in the wise selection of a Princess, adorned as we believe, with every grace and virtue befitting her exalted station, and gifted with such dispositions of mind as cannot fail, when aided and encouraged by your Majesty's own most bright example, to afford the best possible securities for her own happiness, and that of her illustrious partner.

**E**ARL RUSSELL, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received the following Despatch with its Inclosures from the Acting British Consul at Philadelphia:

*Her Majesty's Pro-Consulate, Philadelphia,  
 My Lord, March 20, 1863.*

I HAVE the honour to inclose your Lordship copy of a letter received this morning from W. M. Tilghman, Esq., Solicitor of the Surviving Trustee of the North American Land Company, established in this city by the Honourable Robert Morris and others in 1795, enclosing an advertised notice of proceedings in Escheat against the absent Shareholders in said Company, among whom are several British subjects whose interests amount to nearly two thousand pounds.

A few days ago the Deputy Escheator decided on escheating all the stock to the commonwealth of Pennsylvania; but claims by the rightful holders or their representatives will be allowed and held good on the production of legal proof (namely, that of ownership, or descent from the original holders and identity), if made within five years from the date of the decree of escheat.

Being persuaded by Mr. Tilghman that the representatives of the original owners of this stock are residing in London, and will be able to prove their title to it, I have considered it my duty to lay the matter before your Lordship's attention.

**E**ARL RUSSELL, Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from M. Musurus, the Turkish Ambassador at this Court, the following corrected Translation of

a Turkish Ordinance, to be substituted for the one which was published in the London Gazette of the 10th of March, 1863 :

Translation of the Ordinance addressed on the 29th Redjeb, 1279 of the Hegira (January 7, 1863), to the Board of Customs.

THE repose and security of the Empire, and of all the people residing therein, demanding the prohibition of the trade in arms and munitions of war, the following provisions are made with regard to powder, cannons, arms, and all sorts of munitions of war which may henceforward arrive from abroad, and of which the importation is formally forbidden, in conformity with the Treaties of Commerce recently concluded with friendly Powers.

1. It is absolutely forbidden to import into the Empire, powder in grain, whatever may be the species and the quantity, and whatever be the motive of the importation.

2. The introduction of powder-cartridges, with or without balls, is equally interdicted.

3. Neither may there be imported into the Empire any kinds of cannons, mortars, and howitzers nor their charges, such as bombs, balls, chain-shot, cartridges, and all sorts of projectiles, whether or not containing fulminating matter, bullets for muskets and for pistols, carbines, rifled muskets with or without bayonets, smooth-bored muskets, carbines and pistols, lances, and saltpetre used by troops and in war. Are excepted from this prohibition, arms for shooting and ornament, side arms (armes blanches) such as sabres, swords, knives, and powder for sporting purposes, in small quantities destined for private use.

4. The prohibited articles, enumerated above, which, from the date of the present publication, shall be introduced by sea or by land into the Empire in greater or less quantity, will be immediately confiscated by the State, and delivered over to the military magazines.

The regulations contained in the preceding Articles will, in conformity with the decision of the Imperial Government, be put into operation in the custom-houses of Constantinople and the whole Empire, from the date of the present Ordinance.
