To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

WE, your Majesty's loyal subjects, the Lord Lieutenant, Noblemen, Clergy, Gentry, and other Inhabitants of the county of Buckingham, venture to approach your Royal presence with our dutiful and cordial congratulations on the Marriage of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales with the Princess Alexandra of Denmark.

We avail ourselves of this happy occasion to reiterate the expression of our constant attachment to your Majesty's Royal person and family, and again to give utterance to the deep and affectionate sympathy with which we ever regard all those events and dispensations of providence affecting, in any manner, the happiness and comfort of our august Sovereign's exemplary and illustrious life.

That it may be the will of Almighty God to fulfil and bless all the hopes which your Majesty has founded on this auspicious Marriage, and the sanguine expectations cherished by your devoted and faithful people for the prosperity and continuance of your Royal family and race, is our fervent prayer.
