The late Bombay Engineers (now of the Royal Engineers)	Lieutenant Charles Augustus Goodfellow	For gallant conduct at the attack on the Fort of Beyt, on the 6th of October, 1859. On that occasion, a soldier of the 28th Regiment was shot under the walls of the Fort. Lieutenant Goodfellow rushed under the walls, under a sharp fire of matchlocks, and bore off the body of the soldier, who was then dead, but whom he at first supposed to be wounded only.

And also to command that the said Royal licence and permission be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise to be void and of none effect.

The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto John Musgrave Sagar, of Sandford House, in the parish of Leeds, in the county of York, Gentleman, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of his great uncle Abraham Musgrave, of Bramley, in the parish of Leeds, in the county of York, Esquire, deceased, henceforth take and use the surname of Musgrave, in addition to and after that of Sagar, and bear the arms of Musgrave quarterly, in the first quarter, with those of Sagar; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the Herald's office, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
