" FOURTH SCHEDULE.

" All that piece or parcel of land lying between the Old Palace at Howden and the churchyard, on which stables and gig-house were lately standing, and which is marked A and coloured dark green on the plan annexed to a certain deed of surrender, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and made between the Reverend Joseph Dunnington Jefferson, Clerk, and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England.

" FIFTH SCHEDULE.

" All that close, piece, or parcel of land, containing ten acres and five perches, be the same more or less, situate in the district chapelry of Newland, in the parish of Cottingham, in the county of York, being the southernmost of two closes of land, called 'Newland Friths,' and numbered 1705 on the tithe commutation map of the said parish of Cottingham, bounded on the north-west by the northernmost of the two closes called 'Newland Friths,' now in the possession of Benjamin Haworth, Esquire, on the north-east in part by the Beverley and Barmston Drain, and in part by other land of the said Benjamin Haworth, on the south by the high road leading from the Newland Toll-bar to the River Hull, and on the west by the parsonage garden of the said district chapelry.

" SIXTH SCHEDULE.

" All those two closes of land, containing together fifteen acres, three roods, and thirty-six perches, and situate in the new parish of Stockcross, in the county of Berks, which said closes are known by the respective names of Stockman's Coppice and Stockcross Close, and are numbered 340 and 682, respectively, on the tithe commutation map, bounded on the north-east by the high-road leading from Wickham to Newbury, on the south-east by land now in Chancery, belonging to Wood Speen Farm, on the south-west by land belonging to Mrs. Norman, Mr. Wansborough, and the executors of the late Sir George Berkeley, and on the north-west by land belonging to the Trustees of Newbury Charities for the Poor, and to Mr. James Franklin, and are, with other hereditaments, in the occupation of James Godding, under a lease dated the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.
