

## The Bankruptcy Act, 1861.

## Notice of Dividend Meetings.

Meetings of the Creditors of the Bankrupts hereinafter named will be held, pursuant to the 174th section of the said Act, at the times and places hereinafter mentioned; that is to say:

At the Court of Bankruptcy, Basinghall-street, in the city of London, before Henry Philip Roche, Esq., Registrar:

George Cox, of No. 5, Barbican, in the city of London, Optician, adjudicated bankrupt the 21st day of October, 1861. A Final Dividend Meeting will be held the 9th day of June, 1863, at eleven o'clock precisely.
