TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM TO BE HELD, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY BY HER ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCESS OF WALES, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Princess.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to the Queen,

for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Princess.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, excepting in attendance upon the Ladies of their families.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court until half-past one o'clock.

ALTERATION OF HIGHWAY DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS at a Court of General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the county of Leicester, held on the 6th day of April last, a Provisional Order was made in the words following, that is to say :

"Leicestershire.—At the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Sovereign Lady the Queen, holden at the Castle of Leicester, in and for the county of Leicester, on Monday, the 6th day of April, 1863, before Charles William Packe, Esquire, Chairman, Sir Frederick Thomas Fowke, Baronet, and the Reverend Henry James Hoskins, Clerk, Deputy Chairman, and others, their fellow Justices, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lady the Queen, in the county aforesaid, it is ordered provisionally, as follows :—

"Whereas, Thomas Calvert Beasley, Esquire, the Reverend Frederick John Norman, George Norman, Esquire, Thomas Dickenson Hall, Esquire, and William Fletcher Norton Norton, Esquire, being five of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace, acting in and for the county of Leicester, have, by a writing under their hands, dated the 19th day of February, 1863, required William Freer, Esquire, the Clerk of the Peace for the said county, to add to, or send with, the notice required by law to be given of the holding of the then next Court of General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county, a notice in the Form marked (A) in the schedule to the Act of the 25th and 26th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 61, intituled 'An Act for the better Management of the Highways in England,' or as near thereto as circumstances admit, that at such Court of General or Quarter Sessions, a proposal would be made to the Justices then and there assembled, to alter the present Highway District of Belvoir, in the said county of Leicester, by disannexing the parishes of Eastwell, Eaton, Harby, Saltby, and Statherne, from the Melton Mowbray Highway District, and uniting the same with the Belvoir District of the said county, and did also require the said Clerk of the Peace to send by post, in a prepaid letter, notices in the form aforesaid to the Churchwardens and Overseers of each and every of the parishes above mentioned.

"And whereas, at a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county, held at the Castle of Leicester, in Leicester, in and for the said county, on the 6th day of April, 1863, a proposal was submitted to the said Court by the said Justices that the present Highway District of Belvoir, in the said county of Leicester, be altered by disannexing the parishes of Eastwell, Eaton, Harby, Saltby, and Statherne, from the Melton Mowbray Highway District, and uniting the same with the Belvoir District of the said county.

"And whereas the said Court have heard the said proposal and entertained the same, and have considered the premises, and it has been shown to the said Court, that the notices aforesaid were duly sent to the Churchwardens and Overseers of each of the parishes mentioned.

"Now, therefore, the said Court, in pursuance of the powers vested in the Court, in and by the

said Act, do, by this Provisional Order, direct that the said District, called the 'Belvoir Highway District,' shall be altered by the addition thereto of the said parishes of Eastwell, Eaton, Harby, Saltby, and Statherne; and that such last mentioned parishes be subtracted from the said District, called the 'Melton Mowbray Highway District.'

"And it is further ordered by the said Court, that no portion of the salaries of the officers appointed for the said Melton Mowbray Highway District, or of any other expences incurred by the Highway Board of the said last-mentioned district, for the common use or benefit of the several parishes within such district, shall be charged to the said parishes of Eastwell, Eaton, Harby, Saltby, and Statherne, or any of them, but that such last-mentioned parishes shall be liable only to the district fund of the Belvoir Highway District.
