EARL RUSSELL, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a Despatch from Sir John Crampton, Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Madrid, inclosing a copy of a Royal Decree, published in the Madrid Gazette of the 22nd of December, 1862, by which the system of Passports hitherto in force in Spain has been

abrogated, and other formalities are substituted for ascertaining the identity of foreigners entering Spain, and for legalizing their residence in that country:

The following is translation of the Royal Decree in question:

ROYAL DECREE.

IN conformity with what has been proposed to me by the Minister of the Interior, and in conformity with the Council of Ministers, I decree as follows:

ART. 1. The passports which are still demanded of travellers proceeding abroad and to the colonies, in virtue of the 7th Article of the Royal Decree of February 15, 1854, shall be suppressed from the 1st of January of next year, 1863.

ART. 2. All the other regulations of the said decree remain in force.

ART. 3. In order to avoid that the young men subject to the conscription should escape that responsibility by leaving the kingdom, no certificate of domicile shall be granted them for that purpose, without they guarantee their return to take part in the subscription by the deposit of the sum of 8000 reals, or delivering a deed of sufficient security according to the law on conscription of January 30, 1856.

ART. 4. From the 1st of January, 1863, foreigners shall no longer be asked for their passports on entering Spain, but they must be provided with certificates of domicile, certificates of servitude if they be servants, artisans, or some other document to testify to their identity, the place they come from, and the object of their journey to the Kingdom. The Authorities or their agents shall exact the presentation of this document whenever they may deem it to be necessary.

ART. 5. Any foreigner shall also be admitted into the Kingdom by his merely presenting himself to the Authorities, although not possessing any kind of document, but he must make himself known by means of a declaration, signed by two inhabitants or persons resident in the town or place at which he may present himself, who shall bear witness that they know him, and that his declaration is true; and he must also, in all cases, state where he came from, and the object of his journey.

ART. 6. The visé of passports by Spanish Consuls is suppressed, as also the fee of 8 reals which, according to the 85th Article of the Police Regulations of 1824, was still demanded by the employés of that branch of the service in the frontier provinces of foreigners entering Spain, with the exception of Portuguese subjects, with respect to whom it was abolished by the law of June 3, 1855.

ART. 7. Notwithstanding the provisions contained in the above articles, passports will continue to be granted to those who ask for them, to travel in countries where this requirement is still in force, by presenting the certificate of domicile in the form required by existing regulations on this matter.

ART. 8. This Royal Decree shall be communicated to the Cortés, and the Minister of the Interior shall issue the necessary orders for its execution.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Note from the Turkish Ambassador at this Court, enclosing a copy of a notification, issued by the Porte, respecting the conditions to be observed in regard to merchandize brought from the interior of Turkey to the coast for exportation, and of which the following is a translation :

Merchandize arriving at a port of embarkation may be privately warehoused (*emmagasinée à domicile*) without deposit of duty, provided a declaration be made, stating the amount of consumption duty, and that the merchandize is intended for exportation.

Should a merchant fail to make such a declaration he will be required :

1. At once to export the goods, or,
2. To deposit them in the Customs' warehouses, in case such warehouses are provided for the purpose, in which event the goods will not be required to pay "ardie" duty unless withdrawn for internal consumption, or
3. To deposit them in a private warehouse, having two keys, with the right of the Customs' authorities to place upon it their seal, or
4. To deposit the amount of Customs' consumption duty, the difference between which and the export duty will be restored in the event of the exportation of the goods.

If the merchant confines himself to furnishing simply the above declaration, he will be obliged to export the goods within six months, or he will be compelled, after the lapse of that period, to adopt one of the above specified four conditions. Otherwise the goods will be regarded as consumed in the country, and the merchant will be required to pay the internal consumption duties, the interest being calculated at the rate of one per cent. per month upon the amount of the said consumption duties, from the date of the declaration to the day of payment.

Should the owner of goods destined for exportation be desirous of giving such declaration and not be known to the Customs' authorities, such declaration must bear the guarantee of another merchant, of any nationality, to the satisfaction of the Customs' authorities.

County of Anglesey to wit.

WHEREAS John Williams, Esquire; Robert Brisco Owen, Esquire; Edward Octavius Pearse, Esquire; Robert Jones Hughes, Esquire;

and the Reverend William James Poole, Clerk, being five of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace acting in and for the county of Anglesey, have by a writing under their hands, dated the 26th day of February, 1863, required Richard Owen, Esquire, the Clerk of the Peace for the said county, to add to or send with the notice required by Law to be given of the holding of the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county, a notice in the Form marked (A) in the schedule to the Act of the 25th and 26th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 61, intituled "An Act for the better Management of the Highways in England," or as near thereto as circumstances admit, that at such Court of General Quarter Sessions a proposal would be made to the Justices then and there assembled, to divide the county of Anglesey into Highway Districts, for the purposes of "Highway Acts;" and did also require the said Clerk of the Peace, to send by post, in a prepaid letter, notices, in the form aforesaid, to the Churchwardens and Overseers of each and every of the parishes hereinafter mentioned.

And whereas at a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county, held at the County Hall, in the town of Beaumaris, in the said county, on the 7th day of April, 1863, a proposal was submitted to the said Court, by the said Justices that the county of Anglesey be divided into two Highway Districts.

And whereas the said Court have heard the said proposal and entertained the same, and have considered the premises, and it has been shown to the said Court that the notices aforesaid were duly sent to the Churchwardens and Overseers of each of the parishes mentioned.

Now, therefore, the said Court, in pursuance of the powers vested in the Court, in and by the said Act, do, by this Provisional Order, direct that the parishes under-mentioned, in the said county, shall be formed into Highway Districts, for the purposes of the "Highway Acts," namely, the parishes of Cerrigceinwen, Heneglwys, Llanddona, Llanbedrgoch, Llandysilio, Llansadwrn, Llangoed, Llanddyyfnan, Llanfairpwllgwyngyll, Llanfairmthafarneithaf, Llanedwen, Llanddaniel, Llanfihangel-esceifiog, Llangaffo, Llangeinwen, Llanffinan, Llangefni, Llanfair-y-cwmwd, Llangwyllog, Llanidan, Llaneugrad, Llanallgo, Llanfihangel-tre'r-beirdd, Llangadwaladr, Llangristiolus, Newborough, Pentraeth, Penmynydd, Penrhoslligwy, Tregaeon, and Trefdraeth, into a District, to be called the First Highway District; the parishes of Aberffraw, Bodedern, Bodwrog, Bodewryd, Ceirchiog, Coedana, Gwredog, Llanfairyneubwll, Llanllibio, Llandrygarn, Llanfaelog, Llanfihangel-y-nhowyn, Llantrisant, Llechgwenfarwydd, Llanynghenedl, Llechylched, Llanwenllwyfo, Llandyfrydog, Llanellian, Llanerchymedd, Llanbabo, Llanbadrig, Llanddeusant, Llanfachreth, Llanfaethlu, Llanfairynghornwy, Llanfigael, Llanfechell, Llanfflewyn, Llanfwrog, Llanrhwydrys, Llanrhyddlad, Llanbeulan, Llangwysfan, Rhoscolyn, Rhosbeirio, Rhodogeidio, and Tre-walchmai, into a District, to be called the Second Highway District.

It is further ordered by the said Court, that the number of Waywardens which each parish in each of the said districts shall elect shall be as follows:—In the First District, the parishes of Llangefni and Llanidan, shall each elect two Waywardens, and the other parishes in the said district shall each respectively elect one Waywarden; in the Second District, the parishes of Aberffraw, Bodedern, Llanellian, and Llanbadrig, shall each elect two Waywardens, and the other parishes in the

said district shall each respectively elect one Waywarden.

Lastly, it is ordered that the confirmation of this Provisional Order by a Final Order shall be taken into consideration by the Justices at a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, to be held at the County Hall aforesaid, in and for the said county, on the 30th day of June, 1863.
