WE, your Majesty's loyal subjects, the Bishop of London and the Clergy of the cities of London and Westminster, humbly approach your Majesty with deep respect for your Majesty's person and office, interested like all other your Majesty's subjects in whatever tends to promote your Majesty's personal happiness and to secure the stability of the Throne, we desire to express to your Majesty our thankfulness for the auspicious union of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales with a Princess whose character gives such bright hopes of domestic happiness and public usefulness; while as churchmen we especially revere your Majesty in the great position which Providence has assigned to the Sovereign of these realms in reference to the Established Church, we have been accustomed in common with all our fellow countrymen now for many years to look to your Majesty and the Royal Family as the centre of social life for the whole community, and to acknowledge with thankfulness the example which your Majesty and the revered Prince Consort have given of pure family happiness, and of a life devoted to the best interests of the whole nation, we rejoice that this example is so likely to be reflected in the children of the Royal House as one after another they become heads of families.
