USE OF LOCOMOTIVES IN THE PETTY SESSIONAL DIVISION OF CROYDON.

The following Order is substituted for the Order which appeared in the London Gazette of the 15th May, 1863.

WHEREAS it appears to me, the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the use of Locomotives, unless restricted as herein-after mentioned, on the Turnpike Roads and Highways within the Petty Sessional Division of

Croydon, in the county of Surrey, is dangerous and inconvenient to the public.

I do hereby, by virtue of the provisions of "The Locomotive Act, 1861," by this Order, under my hand, prohibit the use of any kind of Locomotive whatever, propelled by steam, or any other than animal power, on the turnpike-roads and highways, within the above Petty Sessional Division of Croydon, except between the hours of ten at night and six in the morning.

That so much of the River Mersey and of the Tidal Waters communicating therewith, as by virtue of the Act of the Session of the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty (chapter one hundred and ten local and personal) "for better preserving the navigation of the River Mersey," is within and under the jurisdiction and authority of the Conservancy Commissioners, by that Act constituted, shall be entirely excepted out of the operation of Section 8 of the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862.

Provided always, that the present notice shall be read as if the proviso contained in the notice given under the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, and published in the London Gazette of the 5th day of May, 1863, were here repeated mutatis mutandis.
