TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM TO BE HELD, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY BY HER ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCESS OF WALES, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command.*

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Princess.

### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to the Queen, for Her Majesty's approbation.

No presentation card for the Drawing Room can be received at the Lord Chamberlain's Office

after twelve o'clock on Thursday, the 18th of June next.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards, to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Princess.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, excepting in attendance upon the Ladies of their families.

The state apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

*Cork Harbour Buoys.*

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby give notice, that the white buoys heretofore marking the western shoals of Cork harbour, have been replaced by buoys coloured *red*, in order that they may be more distinctly seen.

Also, that the four small buoys marking the Harbour and Turbot rocks, in the fairway of the entrance to the harbour, have been replaced by large conical buoys, as follows:—

*Harbour Rock.*—A buoy chequered red and white, surmounted with a beacon, now marks the eastern side of this rock; and a buoy chequered black and white marks the western side of it.

*Turbot Rock.*—A buoy striped red and white vertically, and surmounted with a beacon, marks the eastern side of this rock; and a buoy striped black and white vertically, marks the western side of it.

The buoys on the western side of the rocks are 10 feet buoys; and those on the eastern side of it are 12 feet buoys, the latter being distinguished by beacons.

(No. 22.)—MEDITERRANEAN—ADRIATIC.

*Fixed Blue Light at Port Chioggia.*

NOTICE has been officially given in the Venice Gazette, of 2nd June, that on and after the 15th day of June, 1863, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at the entrance to Port Chioggia, in the Adriatic.

The light will be a *fixed blue* (sky blue) light, placed at an elevation of 52 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the sixth order.

The lighthouse stands on the large tower of fort St. Felice, at the south point of entrance to the port, and is said to be in lat. 45° 13' 18" N., long. 12° 16' 25" East of Greenwich, or about 2¼ west of that assigned to it in the Admiralty Plan.

(No. 23.)—WEST INDIES—COAST OF GUAYANA.

*Alteration of Light at Cayenne.*

INFORMATION has been received at the Admiralty, that the following alteration has been

made in the light at Cayenne, on the coast of Guayana, and that additional lights have been established.

A *fixed white* light is exhibited from a wooden structure, 39 feet high, erected on the glacis north of fort Cépérou. The light is placed at an elevation of 130 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

A *fixed green* light is exhibited from the north-west angle of the Infantry Barrack, at an elevation of 60 feet above the sea, and visible 8 miles. It stands N.W. of the fort, and N.W. by N. from Cépérou Lighthouse. The two lights in line bearing S.E. by E. lead over the Aimable rock. A vessel entering the river of Cayenne should therefore keep the white light a little open westward of the green light.

A *fixed red* light is shown from the jetty head to assist in entering the river at night.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 24.)—CHINA—EAST COAST.

*Light Vessels in the Yang-Tse Kiang.*

The Harbour Master for the Port of Shanghai has given notice, that on the 12th March, 1863, a light vessel was placed on the Langshan crossing, in the Yang-tse kiang, about 43 miles above the entrance of the Wusung river.

The vessel exhibits a *fixed white* light, is painted red, has two masts, each carrying a ball, and may be passed on either side. She is moored in five fathoms at low water springs, with Langshan pagoda bearing N. by E., Fu-shan fort W. ¼ S., upper end of Muirhead-hill S.W. ½ W., and Plover point S.E. by E. ½ E. When a ship is observed running into danger a gun is fired to attract attention, and the signal (by Marryat's code) of the course that should be steered is then exhibited.

Also, that on the same date, a new light vessel was moored at the entrance of Yang-tse, in the same position as the former vessel. She exhibits a *fixed white* light, visible in clear weather at about 12 miles. In thick weather a *flash* light will also be shown every hour.

**PILOT.**—Pilot schooners cruise off Gutzlaff island, and also between that island and the Amherst rocks, and pilots for the Yang-tse can now be obtained day or night, except when they are all on board of ships, when the pilot schooners anchor near the light vessel.

*Wusung River.*

*Inner Bar Beacons.*—To cross the Inner Bar, three *beacons* have been erected on the east bank of the river; the high or eastern beacon, 60 feet high, is painted *red*, and surmounted by a *red cross*; the north and south beacons are each 40 feet high, painted *black and white*, and each surmounted by a *black ball*. The bar boats are discontinued.

To cross in the deepest water (10 feet at low water spring tides), bring High beacon midway between North and South beacons, E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. With a strong flood the course should be altered when High and North beacons are in one, E. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., or even before; on no account should North and South beacons be brought in one, as they lead over an 8-feet patch, which is marked by a spar buoy with a red flag. When over the bar, approach the shore to half or three-quarters of a cable, then alter course as requisite, keeping the same distance off the east bank of the river the whole way up to Black point.

At Spring tides off the Middle Ground, the streams, both ebb and flood, run 4 knots, and at neaps 2 knots. Vessels going up with the last of the flood are obliged to anchor below the shipping and remain till the ebb streams makes down, which does not take place till  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours after high water by the shore; the flood streams makes about an hour after low water.
