THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, copies of Despatches from Her Majesty's Minister at Berne, reporting that the Swiss Federal Government have accorded, since the 18th instant, to merchandize of British origin, the tariff privileges granted to Belgium by the Treaty just concluded between that country and Switzerland.

In order to acquire the right to be placed upon the footing of Belgian goods, British merchandize imported into Switzerland, must be attested by a Certificate of the form indicated below, and issued either by the Customs authorities at the place of exportation, or by a Swiss Consular Agent resident in

Great Britain.

Now, therefore, the Justices assembled at this present Court of General Quarter Session of the Peace (being the General Quarter Session of the Peace duly appointed for this purpose) in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in them under and by virtue of the said Act of Parliament, having taken the said Provisional Order into consideration, do hereby confirm the same with the following variation, that is to say, with the omission from the said Highway District as

formed in the said Provisional Order of the township of Walton-on-the-Hill.

And lastly, the said Justices do hereby direct and appoint that the confirmation of this further Provisional Order by a Final Order shall be taken into consideration at the Court of General Quarter Session of the Peace, to be held by adjournment at Kirkdale, in and for the said county of Lancaster, on the 14th day of July, in the year of our Lord, 1863.
