This day the Lords being met a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain duties of Inland Revenue; and to amend the laws relating to the Inland Revenue.

An Act to defray the charge of the Pay, Clothing, and contingent and other expenses of the disembodied Militia in Great Britain and Ireland; to grant allowances in certain cases to

Subaltern Officers, Adjutants, Paymasters, Quartermasters, Surgeons, Assistant Surgeons, and Surgeon's Mates of the Militia; and to authorize the employment of the Non-commissioned Officers.

An Act for carrying into effect the Report of the Commissioners appointed to inquire into the State of the dioceses of Canterbury, London, Winchester, and Rochester; and for other purposes.

An Act for the prevention and punishment of offences committed by Her Majesty's subjects in South Africa.

An Act to carry into effect an additional Article to the Treaty of the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, between Her Majesty and the United States of America, for the suppression of the African Slave Trade.

An Act to amend the Act for placing the employment of women, young persons, and children in Bleaching Works and Dyeing Works under the regulations of the Factories Acts.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders under the Local Government Act (1858) relating to the districts of Basford, Teignmouth, Kingston-upon-Hull, Nottingham, Bradford, Ryde, Bedford, Croydon, Batley, Berwick-upon-Tweed, Sheerness, and Bromsgrove.

An Act to authorise the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Coventry, in the county of Warwick, to erect a Market-house in the said city.

ing, altering, and improving the roads from Ashbourne to Sudbury, and from Sudbury to Yoxall Bridge, and from Hatton Moor to Tutbury, and from Uttoxeter to or near the village of Draycott-in-the-Clay, and from Hadley Plain, on the late Forest or Chase of Needwood to Callingwood Plain, on the same late forest or chase;" and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.

An Act with respect to the capital of the Cork and Youghal Railway Company, and to enable that Company to transfer their undertaking.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translation of a Notification issued by the Hamburg Board of Commerce, and forwarded by Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at that place.

NOTIFICATION.

With reference to the publication, on the 27th ultimo, in the Official Gazette of this city, of the conventions entered into on the 4th of April last by all the Elbe-bordering States, the undersigned deputation deems it expedient to call the attention of those persons who are interested in the traffic of the Elbe to some (in a practical point of view) more important rules of the said convention.

From and after the 1st of July next, *instead of all hitherto existing Elbe-tolls*, including the equivalent of the recognition duty, only one Elbe-toll at Wittenberge will be levied for all the river-bordering States, and at the same time the so-called Essling-toll will be discontinued.

The obligation to pay this Elbe-toll is founded on the act of entering the Customs-district at Wittenberge, which begins 1,000 rods above the Chief Custom-house at that place, and ends 1,000 rods below the same.

Goods, which are sent from hence up the river to a place situated below the above-mentioned

Customs-district, or arrive here from such a place, are therefore, from the 1st July, not subject to the payment of toll.

The new Elbe-toll for all articles, which are not enumerated in the list of the second or third class or in that of the articles exempted from tolls, amounts to *sixteen silber-pfennige* (1 silber-groschen 4 pfennige, or 1½d. sterling per centner*), gross weight.

For those articles which will in future belong to the second class (viz., those which belonged to the class hitherto paying ⅓ of the normal rate, as well as lie of all sorts, saltpetre of all sorts, and petroleum), the Elbe-toll will be *eight silber-pfennige* (8 pfe., or 0¼d. sterling);

And for such articles as in future will belong to the third class (viz., those belonging to the class hitherto paying ¼th of the normal rate, as also salt of every kind excepting sodden), the toll will be *two silber pfennige* (2 pfe. or 0¼d. sterling) for one centner, gross weight.

Ships which touch the Customs-district at Wittenberge, will have to exhibit to each of the two Elbe-toll Offices (to the *United Elbe-toll Office* for Austria, Prussia, Saxony, Anhalt, and Hamburg, and to the *common Elbe toll office* for Hanover, Denmark, and Mecklenburg), the original manifest, and will have to deliver a correct copy of the same.

Moreover, such ships which are destined for a place *below Wittenberge*, from whatever place they come, have, at the place of discharge, to deliver their original manifest to the proper authorities; and moreover, such ships which sail from places

below Wittenberge must, as heretofore, have their manifests attested.

Except in the above-mentioned cases, the granting and delivering of manifests hitherto requisite for the Elbe-navigation, will be discontinued after the 1st of July next, as also as a matter of course the obligation of the ships to report themselves at the hitherto existing Elbe-toll offices, excepting at Wittenberge, will cease when the new Elbe-toll regulations come into operation.

With reference to the transition from the hitherto existing Elbe-toll system to the new one, the following *transitory regulations* will come into operation according to an agreement between the Elbe-bordering States.

“Those ships and rafts which have *before the 1st of July next* paid the toll at the hitherto existing toll offices according to the existing regulations, if they should on or after the 1st July next on the same voyage pass the Customs-district at Wittenberge, will only be obliged to pay the toll leviable there, in so far as the same amounts to a larger sum than the toll paid already by them on the same voyage according to the old rates.”

“Those ships and rafts, however, which pass Wittenberge before the 1st of July next, but do not conclude the voyage before that day or after it, have to report themselves at the last of the hitherto existing Elbe-toll offices, which they touch on their voyage, and to pay in addition the Wittenberge Elbe-toll according to the rates fixed in the Convention, in so far as they have not already paid an equal sum for Elbe-tolls or more on the entire voyage.”
