NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 27.)-BALTIC.-GULF OF RIGA.

Lights at the Entrance to the Dwina.

THE Imperial Ministry of Marine at St. Petersburg has given notice, that on and after the 13th day of September, 1863, two lights will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at Fortkamet dike, at the west point of entrance to the Dwina.

The upper light will be a *fixed* and *flashing* white light, showing a *flash* every *half-minute*. It will be placed at an elevation of 103 feet above the mean level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 16 miles.

The lower light will be a *fixed red* light, placed at an elevation of 21 feet above the level of the sea, and should be seen from a distance of 9 miles.

The illuminating apparatus of the upper light is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The tower is iron. The old lights will be discontinued, and the wooden lighthouse taken down.

Also, that on and after the 13th day of September, 1863, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the extremity of the New Magnusholm dike at the east point of entrance to the Dwina.

The light will be a *fixed green* light, elevated 26 feet above the level of the sea, and should be seen from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the sixth order.

GULF OF FINLAND. Alteration of Light on Hango Island.

Also, that on and after the 13th day of July, 1863, the light on Hangö island, on the north side of the gulf of Finland, will be altered from a fixed and flashing white light, showing a flash every minute, to a *fixed* and *flashing* white light, showing a *flash* every two minutes.

Lower Lighthouse on Sourop Point.

With a view of rendering the lower wooden lighthouse on Sourop point, in lat. 59° 28' 24" N. long. 24° 26' 13" East of Greenwich, more easily distinguished from the surrounding wood during the day, the eastern side of the tower has been coloured white. This will assist in rendering the above lighthouse more conspicuous when in line with the upper one, which is also coloured white.
