NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF PARTS OF ACTS BY
RUNCORN, CHESHIRE.

WHEREAS on the 8th day of June, 1863, the Commissioners for carrying into execution an Act, called the Runcorn Improvement Act, 1852, adopted certain portions of the Local Government Act, 1858, and of the Acts incorporated therewith, that is to say, all such portions of the said Act and of the Acts incorporated therewith as relate to the supply of water. And whereas, notice of such adoption has been duly given in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do hereby give notice, that the hereinbefore described portions of the said Acts, have been duly adopted by the said Runcorn Commissioners, and that such portions have the force of law within the district of the Runcorn Commissioners aforesaid.

NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

*Department of the Accountant-General
of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset-
House, July 17, 1863.*

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons interested therein, that preparations are now being made for the intended distribution of the compensation for tonnage bounty, and net proceeds of the "Manuella," captured on the 10th August, 1860, by Her Majesty's ship "Brisk."

Agents or other persons having any just and legal demand, unliquidated, against the said proceeds, are required to transmit the particulars of any such demand to the Registrar of the High Court of Admiralty, in order that the same may be examined, taxed, and allowed by that Officer, and paid under the sanction of the Judge of the said Court.

Agents and all other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share belonging to any captor, are requested, with as little delay as possible, to transmit the same, accompanied by the usual documents, to the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset-House."

Due notice will be given, by future advertisements in the London Gazette, of the date proposed for the commencement of distribution; and, at the same time, the amount of an individual's share in the respective classes will be announced.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Herne, in the county of Kent, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons,

And whereas, at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held at the Vestry Room, in the Parish Church, after public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, it was resolved—

"That the Churchwardens and Overseers of the said parish be, and they are hereby authorized, on obtaining the sanction of the Poor Law Board, to hire any room for the purpose of holding any vestry or other meeting, for the transaction of any business of or relating to the parish, and for the power to appoint a Vestry Clerk."
