#### SHIPSTON-ON-STOUR HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Provisional Order for Union—25 and 26 Vict., c. 61. s. 39.

#### County of Warwick.

**W**HEREAS at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the county of Warwick, held at Warwick, in the said county, on the 7th day of April, 1863, a Final Order was made by the Court, confirming a Provisional Order made at the then next preceding Quarter Sessions held at Warwick on the 6th day of January, 1863, constituting the following parishes and hamlets situate

in the county of Warwick, a highway district for the purposes of the Highway Acts, namely,—Ilmington and Compton Scorpion, Halford, Honington, Idlicote, Whatcote, Compton Wyneattes, Winderton, Brailes with Chelmscote, Sutton, Whichford with Ascot, Stourton, Cherington, Long Compton with Weston, Little Wolford, Burmington, Barcheston, Willington, Stretton-on-Fosse with Ditchford, to be called "The Shipston-on-Stour Highway District."

And whereas at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the county of Warwick, held at Warwick aforesaid, on the 30th day of June, 1863, on the requisition of five Justices of the Peace of the said county, two of whom, that is to say, Sir George Richard Philips, Baronet, and William Dickins, Esquire, are resident in the district before mentioned, a proposal was made to the Court to alter the said district by uniting therewith the following parishes and hamlets situate in the county of Worcester, namely—Shipston-on-Stour, Tidmington, Tredington, Armscot, Blackwell, Darlingscote, Longdon, Newbold and Talton, which said last-mentioned parishes and hamlets have already been formed into a highway district for the last-mentioned county. And the said Court having taken the said proposal into consideration, doth provisionally order that the above mentioned parishes and hamlets situate in the said county of Warwick, be united to the above mentioned parishes and hamlets situate in the county of Worcester, and form together one Highway District, to be called "The Shipston-on-Stour Highway District."

And it is ordered by the Court, that the number of Waywardens which each parish and hamlet in the said district within the said county of Warwick shall elect, shall be one for each of the said parishes and hamlets heretofore separately maintaining its own highways.

And it is further ordered by the Court, that the confirmation of this Provisional Order, by a Final Order, shall be taken into consideration by the Justices at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, to be held at Warwick, in the said county of Warwick, on Tuesday, the 20th day of October, 1863.
