

## The Bankruptcy Act, 1861.

## Notice of the Granting of an Order of Discharge.

The Bankrupt hereinafter named has had an Order of Discharge Granted or Suspended as hereinafter mentioned by the Court acting in prosecution of his Bankruptcy, and such Order will be delivered to the Bankrupt unless an appeal be duly entered against the judgment of the Court, and notice thereof be given to the Court:
