(No. 37.)—BALTIC—GULF OF FINLAND.

Fixed Light at Kronstat.

THE Imperial Ministry of Marine at St. Petersburg has given notice, that on and after the 13th day of July, 1863, a light would be exhibited from the lighthouse recently built on the south bastion of the military port of Kronstat, Gulf of Finland; and that the old light hitherto shown from the south bastion would be discontinued.

The light is a fixed white, elevated 38 feet above the level of high water, and visible over the horizon of the Great and Little Roads, or between the bearings from N.N.W. 3 W., round by west and south, to N.E. by E. 1 E. from the lighthouse.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses of the sixth order. The position of the lighthouse is given as lat. 59° 58′ 14″ N., long. 29° 48′ 30″ East of Greenwich. Near the lighthouse is a bell, which in foggy weather is rung at short intervals four times in the hour.

NORTH SEA-COAST OF HOLLAND.

The Minister of Marine at the Hague has given notice, that, with a view of avoiding the shoals called the Eijerlandsche Gronden, a new revolving light will be shown in the winter of 1864-65 on the downs north of the island of Texel.

A fixed red light from an iron column, 20 feet high, on the battery on Pointe Blanche, on the north side of entrance to the Rade d'Hyères. The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order. The light is elevated 171 feet, and visible at 5 miles. The lighthouse is in lat. 43° 5′ 16″ N., long. 6° 21′ 57″ E.

Lighthouse on Smith Island.

THE United States Lighthouse Board has given notice, that the lighthouse on Smith island, near Cape Charles, the north point of the entrance of Chesapeake bay, has been so much injured by lawless and malicious persons as to prevent the exhibition of the light. It is also feared that other lights in that vicinity may not for the present be relied on.

Fog Signal at Whales Back Lighthouse.

Also, that a fog bell, acted on by machinery, has been established at Whales Back lighthouse station, at the entrance of Portsmouth harbour, New Hampshire; and would be kept in operation from and after the 1st day of August, 1863. The bell tower is a frame structure, 25 feet high, whitewashed, standing upon the lighthouse pier, and attached to the southern side of the light tower.

The signal is a steel bell, which is struck four times in a minute, at regular intervals, during fogs, snow storms, and thick weather, and should be heard a distance of one-quarter to 4 miles, according to circumstances of surf, weather, wind, &c.

The bell is at an elevation of 55 feet above mean low water.
