LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

BARNET, IN THE COUNTIES OF MIDDLESEX AND HERTFORD.

WHEREAS appeals under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, have been duly made to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by certain owners and rate-payers within the district of Barnet, in the counties of Middlesex and Hertford, setting forth grounds on which they dispute the validity of a vote for the adoption of the said Act within the said district. And whereas inquiry has been duly directed into the circumstances of the case, and such enquiry has been duly made, and the result thereof reported to me :

Now, therefore, I do issue the following order, and do determine the questions arising on such appeals as follows :

That the Local Government Act, 1858, has been duly adopted within the said district of Barnet, and that the said appeals be dismissed.
