THE Secretary of State for War has received three Despatches with their Enclosures, addressed to him by Lieutenant-General Cameron, C.B., Commanding the Troops in New Zealand, of which the following are copies :

*Head Quarters, Queen's Redoubt,
Auckland, New Zealand,*

My Lord, July 20, 1863.

ON the 17th instant, at 10 A.M., a large number of Natives were observed entrenching themselves on the heights of the Koheroa, in front of the Camp of the 2nd Battalion 14th Regiment, apparently with the intention of obstructing our further advance up the Waikato.

Lieutenant-Colonel Austen, who was commanding on the spot, immediately called in all his working parties, got his battalion under arms, and moved in skirmishing order against the enemy, followed by the detachments of the 12th and 70th, which were at the time arriving at the Camp as a reinforcement. The strength and composition of the force are shewn in the margin.*

Lieutenant-Colonel Gamble, Deputy Quarter-master-General, who happened to be on the Koheroa superintending the encampment of the 12th and 70th, having sent me a report of what was going on, I at once hastened across the Mungatawhiri, and overtook the troops during their advance.

When we came within musket shot of the enemy, he opened a sharp fire upon us, to which our skirmishers replied which such effect that he was soon compelled to retire. This he did slowly, and without any precipitation.

The ground over which he retired was most favourable for defence, as the only road by which we could advance against him led for about five miles over very narrow and tortuous fern ridges, the sides of which were too precipitous to admit of our turning his position by a flank movement, and at several well selected points completely commanding the narrow necks over which we were

compelled to move to the attack, he had constructed lines of rifle-pits.

These he defended with great obstinacy, and as we had no artillery in the field, we could only dislodge him from them with the bayonet, which was done with great gallantry by the young soldiers of the 14th, led by their commanding officer Lieutenant-Colonel Austen, who, I regret to say, received a wound in the arm during the action. After we had driven them from the second line of rifle-pits, where they made their most determined stand, a large number of them left the ridge, and turning to the right, retreated down a narrow and steep gully where they were exposed for a long time to a close and destructive fire from our men on the heights above, by which many of them were killed. The rest were driven before us until they reached the Maramarna (a small tributary of the Waikato), which they crossed precipitately, some in canoes, and others by swimming.

Having no means of effecting the passage of the river, we were obliged to discontinue the pursuit, and I accordingly ordered the troops back to camp.

I enclose a list of our casualties, which were few considering the time the engagement lasted (from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.), and the strength of some of the enemy's positions.

I cannot speak too highly of the conduct of all the officers and men engaged, or of the able manner in which the troops were led by their commanding officers, viz., Lieutenant-Colonel Austen, 14th; Major Ryan, 70th; and Major Miller, 12th.

Among the officers who had the good fortune to have the opportunity of distinguishing themselves by conspicuous forwardness in the attack, were Captain Strange, 14th, who did good service with the advanced skirmishers; Captain Phelps, who led his company to the charge; Lieutenants Armstrong and Glancy, and Ensign Green, 14th.

Surgeon-Major Carte, M.B., 2nd Battalion, 14th, the Senior Medical Officer in the field, rendered prompt assistance to the wounded, many of whom he attended under fire.

Colonel Mould, C.B., Commanding Royal Engineer, was also present, and ready to afford his valuable assistance, if required.

Lieut.-Colonel Gamble, the Deputy Quarter-master-General, Major M'Neill, Aide-de-Camp, and my extra Aide-de-Camp, Lieut. St. Hill, the

only officers of the staff who had an opportunity of taking part in the engagement, were most active during its progress, and gave me the greatest assistance throughout.

The enemy had from 300 to 400 men in the field, the whole belonging to the tribes of the Waikato. His loss must have been considerable.

Immediately after the action we counted 21 killed, 9 more on the following day, and others have since been found. Several Chiefs fell,

among them one of the uncles of the Maori King. The enemy himself acknowledged to have had a great many wounded.

I enclose a sketch of the ground, made by Lieutenant-Colonel Gamble, after the action.

MY LORD,

I HAVE the honour to forward copy of a report (17th July, 1863) from Captain Ring, 2nd Battalion, 18th Regiment, of an attack upon a convoy under his charge by an ambuscade of natives, on the 17th instant, on the road between the Queen's Redoubt and Drury.

I have since ascertained that the ambuscade consisted of not less than 140 natives, and considering the very superior numbers by which Captain Ring's small detachment was attacked, I feel sure that your Lordship will concur with me that no troops could have acquitted themselves better under such trying circumstances.

SIR,

I HAVE the honour to report, for your information, that on my march from the Queen's Redoubt to Drury this day, my escort, &c., as per margin,* were fired upon by the natives at Stone Depot, near Baird's Farm. The fire was opened on my advance-guard, on both flanks; and my right flank and rear was immediately fired upon. The fire took effect upon the centre of the convoy. One driver and two horses of his cart fell, which, dividing the convoy, &c., was taken advantage of by the natives, who, rushing in force across the road, opened fire in the left flank, thus exposing my rear-guard, consisting of prisoner and escort, to a severe fire from the bush on each flank and right rear. I immediately retired with as many men as I could concentrate, and, firing, kept the enemy from surrounding my very small party, though in skirmishing order. During the contest, the fire of the enemy was well returned, and I personally saw five or six natives fall. They came out in the open; but a charge quickly drove them into the bush. Finally, their attempting to surround my party obliged me to retire to Mr. Martin's house, which I occupied until reinforced. I beg to annex the following list of killed and wounded:

MY LORD,

I HAVE the honour to forward copies of reports (July 23rd, 1863) from Captain Ring, 2nd Battalion, 18th, and Colonel Wyatt, 65th Regiment, of a skirmish which took place between detachments under their command, and a body of rebels, in the bush near Drury.

Both Colonel Wyatt and Captain Ring appear to have acted with great judgment on this occasion, and the officers and men under their command deserve great credit for their conduct; those under Captain Ring for the firmness with which they held their ground a long time against superior numbers; and those of Colonel Wyatt's detachment (including a small detachment of volunteers, who were for the first time under fire), for their prompt support of the former, and the gallantry with which they attacked and beat off the enemy.

SIR,

I HAVE the honour to state, for your information, that at noon, the 22nd instant, I received information that two settlers had been fired upon by a body of natives, and that one of the settlers was killed, and hearing firing in the vicinity of Pukekewereke, about two miles from my camp, I immediately proceeded with 100 men of the detachment under my command, and close to the above named place I fell in with natives, who were engaged with 16 volunteers, I opened fire and the natives retreated to my former entrenchment above the wharé, at Keri Keri, the firing of the skirmishers drove them down the side of the hill into the brushwood, the leading skirmishers on the right, under Lieutenant Wray, took possession of the hill and kept up fire on them, I, with another body of skirmishers, proceeded to take that on the right flank, but found that the natives who mustered a strong force nearly surrounded me, here I lost one man killed, whose rifle and bayonet was taken possession of by the natives, though not without serious loss to them. I then concentrated my men on the entrenchment, and having heard from an Artillery Officer who rode up to my position that the 65th Regiment was in my immediate vicinity, I requested that he would inform the Officer Commanding 65th Regiment that there was a track in the enemy's rear, and if an attack were made in that direction it would be of great service. As

it was quite impossible for me to follow so strong a force of the enemy into the bush with my so small a force, I remained in the entrenched position until close on sunset, keeping a steady fire on the enemy, who were endeavouring to obtain the body and ammunition of the private who was killed, and who I would not leave. I repeatedly tried to obtain possession of the body by sending out volunteers of the man's company, but desisted, finding that it would entail greater loss. I was about retiring, leaving a rear-guard in the entrenchment, when the Mounted Artillery arrived. Immediately after I saw the 65th appear. The natives then drew off their right flanking movement, and retreating into the bush enabled me to obtain the body of the man of my detachment. This accomplished the whole force withdrew.

The Officers engaged on this occasion were Lieutenant Wray, Ensign J. B. Jackson, and Ensign Butts, whose assistance, coupled with the steadiness of my men, merits unqualified approbation.

SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT.

I BEG to enclose the enclosed list just received from Captain Clear of the Auckland Militia, who at first was engaged with the enemy, and these joined my force, and rendered every possible assistance, and behaved in a most creditable manner.

Camp Drury,

July 23, 1863.

SIR,

I HAVE the honour to request you will inform the Lieutenant-General that yesterday forenoon, having been informed by a Mounted Volunteer that a man had been shot by the Natives on Mr. Hayes' Grounds, and that his house was threatened. I immediately got my available force under arms (as per margin*) and proceeded in that direction, directing as I went along, the detachment of the Militia to crown a small knoll, and thus protect the approaches to Drury, and also ordering Lieutenant Raitt, R.A., and his troopers to proceed in the direction of the Wairoa Valley, for the purpose of calling off any marauding parties. On arriving at Mr. Hayes's, his son Ensign James B. Hayes of the Militia volunteered to act as guide to my party, and I scoured all the bush in that vicinity with 30 men, having previously

directed Lieutenant and Adjutant Lewis, with 40 men to remain outside, and thus cut off any natives attempting to escape. On reaching the native settlement of Keri Keri, I heard some desultory firing on my left, and was led to understand by some militiamen, that they had fired at some natives towards the Wairoa escaping into the bush.

Being satisfied with this explanation, I returned towards Drury, having previously picked up the body of the murdered man, and sent it there.

When within one and a half mile of that settlement, I was overtaken by Veterinary Surgeon Anderson, R.A., who informed me that a detachment of the 2nd Battalion, 18th Regiment, was in a very precarious position near Wairoa, and required a reinforcement, as they could not do more than hold their position.

On this I retraced my steps towards Keri Keri, and just before sunset, entered the main bush under the guidance of Ensign Hayes.

As my party advanced, firing and shouting were more distinctly heard, and after proceeding about half-a-mile, a turn of the road brought me suddenly upon the combatants, the 2nd Battalion, 18th Regiment, upon an entrenched knoll, and the natives on the lower ground, but pressing them hard on three sides, when the detachment, 65th Regiment, cut off in their turn the immediate rear of two of them. Lieutenant Pennefather, who commanded the rear-guard, finding himself exposed to a cross fire from both the 2nd Battalion, 18th Regiment, and natives, directed the bugler to sound the regimental "call," and the "fire," and with a loud cheer, which was answered by the 2nd Battalion, 18th Regiment, a rapid and continuous fusillade was opened on the natives ensconced in the gullies, and sheltered by trees from the fire of the 2nd Battalion, 18th Regiment.

Being completely taken by surprise, they, after a smart action of about ten minutes, fled towards the denser bush, but the darkness which had now begun to set in, rendered all attempts at searching for their dead and wounded perfectly futile.

The enemy's fire being now completely silenced, I directed both parties to move off to their respective camps, and while so doing a few desultory shots were fired high over their heads.

I must bring to the Lieutenant-General's notice the cool and intrepid gallantry evinced on this occasion by Lieutenant Raitt, Royal Artillery; Captain Gresson, Lieutenant and Adjutant Lewis (who commanded No. 1 Company, the officers being both sick), and Lieutenant Pennefather, who commanded the advanced guard; and I trust you will recommend Ensign James B. Hayes, of the Militia, to the favourable consideration of His Excellency the Governor, for his coolness and cleverness in guiding the party under my command so rapidly into the scene of this brief but smart action.

With a proud heart I must bring to the Lieutenant-General's notice the cool and quiet order and gallantry displayed by all ranks of the force under my command, and the unflinching patience with which the men bore the harassing and toilsome march to and from the scene of action.

I am happy to say that the casualties of my party were limited to one Private killed.

“That the Churchwardens be and they are hereby authorized to make application to the Poor Law Commissioners to make an Order to put the Statute 13th & 14th Victoria, c. 57., in force in the said united parishes, and to authorize the Churchwardens and Overseers of the said united parishes, with the sanction of a majority of the Vestry, to purchase land or buildings, and if necessary to erect a suitable building for the purpose of Vestry and other meetings for the transaction of the business of the said United Parishes.”

And whereas at another meeting of the Vestry of the said united parishes, held at the Vestry Room, after public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the sixteenth day of July last, it was resolved,—

“That the Churchwardens and Overseers of the said United Parishes be and they are hereby authorized, with the sanction of the Poor Law Commissioners, to purchase the present Vestry Room at the price of eighty pounds, and to pay all expenses attending the transaction.”

And whereas application in writing has been made to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the before-recited resolutions.

Now, therefore, We, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct, that so much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of

“Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room or buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other meetings for the transaction of any business of, or relating to the said united parishes shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within, the said united parishes.

And we hereby order and direct, that a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.
