Warsaw, November 4, 1863.

MY LORD,

I HAVE the honour to forward to your Lordship a duplicate copy of the list of Lost Debentures and Coupons of the Polish Mortgage Society or Landed Bank, which have been officially published by that establishment, calling upon all parties

who happen to be in possession of the Debentures bearing the same numbers, or of the Coupons, to come forward within twelve months from the 22nd of October, and to make good their claim within three years in the Civil Courts, or five years in the Criminal Courts of this country, as the case may be, failing which duplicate copies of the said Debentures, with their Coupons, will be delivered to the parties claiming to be the rightful owners of such Debentures or Coupons.

A portion of these are the Debentures of the Treasury of this Kingdom, which were appropriated by the National Government in June last.

In consequence of applications made by the Government Commission of Revenue and Treasury, as well as by various private persons, for the issue and delivery of Duplicates in lieu of the Mortgage Bonds and Coupons lost by the applicants, stolen from them, or otherwise destroyed, which are enumerated in the hereunto annexed specification, consisting of 16 numbered pages besides the title-page, and officially attested under the date of this present notice; and after each of the losers had proved by means provided by law, that he had been really the last possessor of the Mortgage Bonds and Coupons indicated in the above-mentioned specification, and that the Mortgage Bonds and Coupons claimed by him were marked by the identical numbers named by him; the Chief Directing Board in pursuance and execution of Art. 124 sqq. of the law of the 1st (13th) day of June, 1825, of § 213, sqq. of the law of the 2nd (14th) day of March, 1826, and of Art. the 48th of the law of the 28th day of June (10th day of July), 1860, do hereby summon every person possessing any of the Mortgage Bonds and Coupons contained in the above-mentioned specification, to appear with it before the Chief Directing Board of the Landed Credit Society, within twelve months from the date of this present notice; for each of the Mortgage Bonds and Coupons aforesaid which should not be presented within the named period of time, shall be proclaimed of no value, and a duplicate thereof shall be delivered to the interested party in its stead.

If, however, the possessor of the questioned Mortgage Bond or Coupon appear and present the same to the Chief Directing Board, and were to deny to the claimant the right of property to the said Mortgage-Bond or Coupon, the Chief Directing Board will detain the presented Mortgage-Bond or Coupon, deliver to the bearer of it a certificate of having detained the same, and give a notice of it to the loser, through the medium of the Usher of a Court of Justice. Within six months from the date of such

notice, the claimant of the duplicate shall be bound to deliver to the Chief Directing Board the vouchers of the issue of a summons before the Civil Court of Justice, and of the payment of the registering fee, or of the plaint brought before a Criminal Court, and deliver to the Chief Directing Board the decisive, final, or lawfully valid sentence passed thereupon in civil proceedings within three years, and in criminal prosecution within five years after the above notice. Civil law suits of this kind shall be called and judged from the roll of short-ened proceedings, and the registering fee paid by the plaintiff may be recovered by the defendant. Should the above-mentioned documents not be delivered, the litigation shall be considered not extant, after the lapse of the above determined periods, and the Chief Directing Board will restore the legal course to the questioned Bond and Coupons.
